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### NEWICK READING ROOM TRUSTEES' REPORT

### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2021

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 December 2021.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the Charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

### Objectives and activities

The Charity's objects are to provide a reading room for the parish of Newick and as a place of parochial entertainment, as a gymnasium and as a meeting place for clubs

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

### Achievements and performance

Because of the ongoing COVID 19 pandemic and the strict cleaning requirements the building was let only to the Newick Pre-School, the local play group, during the financial year under review. The Pre-School was recently rated outstanding by OFSTED.

#### Financial review

The statement of financial activities on page 3 shows that the total incoming resources for the year amounted to £44,992, due to a large legacy left to the charity. After expenses and expenditure in accordance with the terms of the Trust, the net income for the year was £40,529.

It is the policy of the Charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which have not been designated for a specific use, to provide sufficient funds to cover the running costs of the Charity and to respond to emergency applications for grants which arise from time to time. The trustees consider that unrestricted funds should be in the region of £10,000.

The major risks to which the Charity is exposed, as identified by the trustees, continue to be reviewed and systems have been established to mitigate those risks.

The trustees do not enter into commitments in excess of their available cash resources and as a result they operate in a low risk environment. Any drop in income received will be matched by an appropriate reduction in expenditure in the medium term.

### Structure, governance and management

The Charity was established with its governing document dated 12 November 1894 and was registered with the Charities Commission on 13 November 1964

## NEWICK READING ROOM INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

### TO THE TRUSTEES OF NEWICK READING ROOM

We report on the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31 December 2021, which are set out on pages 3 to 7.

Independent examiner's statement

## Newick Reading Room Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2021

#### Note

### 1 Accounting policies

### **Charity information**

Newick Reading Room is an unincorporated charity registered with the Charity Commission under the reference 237989.

### 1.1 Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act 2011 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from January 2015. The Charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The Charity has applied Update Bulletin 1 as published on 2 February 2016 and does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention and are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the Charity and rounded to the nearest £.

### 1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the accounts, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to contribute in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the Trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the accounts.

### 1.3 Charitable funds

*Unrestricted funds* - these represent funds that are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives unless the funds have been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds - these are income funds that must be spent on restricted purposes and details of the funds held and restrictions provided are shown in the notes to the accounts.

### 1.4 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Where incoming resources have related expenditure (as with fundraising or contract income) the incoming resources and related expenditure are reported gross in the SOFA. Grants and donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

### 1.5 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.
