Dorridge Methodist Church Annual Report 2021-22.

Following an easing in the Coronavirus Pandemic it is pleasing that this year has been one of recovery. Regular Church Services have recommenced and many of the organisations using the rooms at Church have returned. Activity has therefore increased and we are looking to that to continue next year.

The opportunity has been taken to look closely at how and what we do and consequently changes have been made and this review will continue. Some Services have been discontinued and some of the Church Organisations have changed their way of doing things or have unfortunately taken the decision to close. Our Services have become a little shorter, there is more space between chairs in Church and the way Communion is taken and Offerings are made has changed.

It is good that despite these changes attendance has not dropped noticeably and consequently finances have been maintained. Many thanks to all our members who have maintained or increased their contributions. Also thanks to those members and their spouses and friends who step up to help with the projects that go on in the life of the Church throughout the year.

This has enabled us to continue with remedial work and improvements to the Church premises and to make additional monetary donations to areas of the Methodist Church where it has been felt necessary.

We have continued to use computer technology although to a lesser degree and some meetings do continue via Zoom. The Church Community is well supported Pastorally although towards the end of the year we lost the services of our Lay Pastoral Worker and we are hoping that she will be replaced although this position will also be reviewed.

A decision was made to register the church for Same Sex Marriages and we continue to support the local community with Funerals and Baptisms.

The Church vestibule has continued to be decorated appropriately throughout the year and we are looking at the provision of benches at the front of the Church for local community use in commemoration of the Late Queen Elizabeth II and her earlier Platinum Jubilee.

We thank God that we have come through the worst of the Pandemic and that the Church is now looking to move forward through the coming year.
