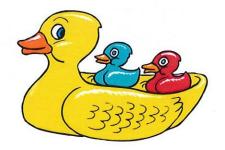

Section C - Objectives and activities

The aims of the pre-school are to enhance the development and education of children primarily under statutory school age by encouraging parents to understand and provide for the needs of their children through community groups and by:

(a) offering appropriate play, education and care facilities, family learning and extended hours groups, together with the right of parents to take responsibility for and to become involved in the activities of such groups, ensuring that such groups offer opportunities for all children whatever their race, culture, religion, means or ability
(b) encouraging the study of the needs of such children and their families and promoting public interest in and recognition of such needs in the local areas

(c) instigating and adhering to and furthering the aims and objects of the Pre-school Learning Alliance.

Section D - Achievements and performance

The Playgroup currently operates its services from a Portakabin in St Kenelms School Grounds, Minster Lovell. The portakabin is maintained throughout the year to ensure the Playgroup maximises its useful economic life.

Section E - Financial Review

The Receipts and Payments account for the Year ended 31 March 2022 showed that Minster Lovell Playgroup had an excess of Income over Expenditure on "Normal" activities of £1,382.

Fees have decreased by 4.9% in 2022. This decrease is down on 2021 (where fees decreased by 18.7%). Numbers are continuing to increase for 2022/23.

Overall, Total Funds available at the Year end amount to £33,994, which includes £15,253 held in a Deposit Account. Due to some restrictions being lifted for Covid, Fundraising did increase for 2021/22, with the Coffee Morning held in November 2021 raising a successful £653 and the Sponsored Walk in the Summer raising £619.

Section F - Other optional information

After a review of the electricity account by SSE Energy Solutions (previously named Southern Electric), the account was found to be in arrears by £739.47 as at 28th March 2022

The arrears was paid in June 2022, and the monthly direct debit has increased to £163.00. This will be reflected in the 2023 Accounts.
