The Trustees present their Annual Report and the financial statements for the year ended 7 January 2019. ### **Legal Status and Objects**

The Charity was formed under a Trust Deed dated 8 October 2010.

The objects are to promote or advance any purpose which is charitable according to the law of England and Wales for the benefit of the public by the payment of grants, loans and other payments to such charity or charities as the Trustees shall from time to time think fit.

During the year, the Trustees have been mindful of the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. All manner of charitable causes are supported and the assistance given by the Charity ensures that the public are benefited throughout the local area and beyond.

### **Appointment of Trustees**

The Trustees are appointed by the board of Trustees for an unlimited period. The board of Trustees endeavour to appoint Trustees who will provide value and practical skills to the charity.

### **Review of Activities and Financial Performance**

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the legislative requirements of the Charities Act 2011 as applicable to smaller charities in England and Wales.

The Trustees have taken the option available to them to prepare the accounts on a receipts and payments basis because the gross income of the charity is less than £250,000.

The Trustees made donations to 14 charities (2018: 34) totalling £145,000 (2018: £218,910) during the year.

#### **Reserves Policy**

During the period, the Trustees are satisfied that the level of cash funds, currently £9,515 (2018: £6,230), are adequate to meet the objects of the Charity. Additional income has been received since the year end and is being distributed by the Trustees.
