## **Objectives and activities**

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

 The relief of poverty, sickness and distress and the preservation of health for the benefit of the inhabitants of Penyem village and surrounding area in The Gambia, by the funding of community based projects including the provision of fresh water supplies, medical and educational facilities and such other facilities as the trustees shall deem necessary.

To provide or assist in the provision of recreational facilities in particular but not exclusively a sports ground in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals in Penyem

village and surrounding area in The Gambia who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

During this year NTF has continued the sponsorship programme of 95 students. We have secured funding to fund the full running of the village Nursery School. We have funded the salaries and maintenance of Penyem Health Centre including the salaries of the full time doctor, nurse and ambulance driver, with the nurse and driver continuing their in service training at a nearby hospital. The village ambulance running costs have been fully funded. We have continued to provide funding for the NTF anti Malaria project which funds testing and treatment for those villagers suffering from Malaria. This treatment *is not* completely free to the patients and they are encouraged to contribute towards the cost, although no-one is turned away if they cannot afford to pay.

We have made significant progress in our shipping of equipment and other items to The Gambia. We now have a reliable shipping agent with whom we liaise. This is a local company, who provide competitive shipping rates. We buy space in a container and send important items that the NTF Committee (Penyem) have requested. This year we, have made 3 shipments totalling 4 cubic metres. This is funded by various local fundraising events mainly by local Northampton Schools.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year	We continue to sponsor 95 students of all ages through their years of Education. Many of the students who were originally sponsored from Nursery School age in and around 2006 are now coming to the end of their secondary education. Due to the success of this ongoing support, we have an increasing number of students wishing to advance onto further education. We operate a Bursary Support fund for these students and we have been able to increase again this year the amount of funding, but not sufficiently to cover all the requests for Bursary Support. Initially in 2006 most of the students were of Nursery age. Now there are more attending the village Upper Basic School. Whilst we do all we can to help at the school, our funding is limited.
	Whilst we do all we can to help at the school, our funding is limited.  Since the outbreak of Covid in March 2020, no representative of NTF have been able to visit Penyem. Therefore, it has been necessary to ensure that there is a rigorous insight into the spending of funds in Penyem. There is a strong NTF committee in Penyem who report directly to Penyem Village Development Committee and also to NTF Committee in UK. We are confident that the money is well spent. Any surplus funds in Penyem (maybe through beneficial exchange rates) are kept in reserve and either carried forward to offset the next budget payment, or used to the general wellbeing of the village. An example of this is to provide support to the most needy villagers with providing rice.
