Trustees' Report for the Year Ended 28th February 2022

The trustees present their annual report and unaudited accounts for the Year Ended 28th February 2022 and confirm they comply with the Charities Act 1993, as amended by the Charities Act 2006, the trust deed and the Charities SORP 2005.

Objects & Activities for the Public Benefit

Objectives & Aims: -

- 1) The relief of financial need and suffering among victims of natural or other kinds of disaster in the form of money (or other means deemed suitable) for persons, bodies, organisations and/or countries affected [including the provision of medical aid, food aid, shelter etc.].
- 2) The relief and assistance of people in any part of the world who are victims of war or natural disaster, trouble, or catastrophe in particular by the supply of medical & food aid to such persons.

Activities & Achievements: -

The objects of the charity were carried out and achieved by the following;

Projects in Syria:

Projects dated 06/04/2021: Distribution of a food relief basket in the holy month of Ramadan to displaced families from Idlib countryside (Maarat al-Numan -Saraqeb and their surroundings) and poor families living in the city of Binnish. Number of beneficiaries 50 families. The contents of the Ramadan basket (bulgur- rice oil sugar vermiceli - peas - lentils tomato molasses mortadella - pasta - salt cheese potatoes). Aqeeqah meat was distributed to the most needy families. Blankets and Aid was distributed to the most needy orphans. Distribution of Ramadan meals consisting of (Kabsa rice, bulgur, freekeh chicken or lamb) to the displaced people living in the camps (Aisha Orphanage Village) 25 meals per day throughout the blessed month of Ramadan Number of beneficiary families 25 families. Value of projects: £3000. Geographical area: Binnish city and surrounding farms and Aisha Orphanage Village.

Projects dated 29/04/2021: Distribution of a food relief basket in the holy month of Ramadan to widows, orphans and poor families living in the city of Binnish. The contents of the Ramadan basket (bulgur rice vermicelli - peas - lentils - tomato molasses mortadella pasta salt cheese - potatoes) oil sugar Distribution of Ramadan meals consisting of (Kabsa rice, bulgur, freekeh chicken or lamb) to the displaced people living in the camps (Al-Yaman camp) 115 pounds per day throughout the holy month of Ramadan. Number of beneficiary families 115 families. Iftar Meals were distributed to the most needy orphans, widows and families. Value: £6050. Geographical area: Binnish city and Al-Yaman camp.

Trustees' Report for the Year Ended 28th February 2022 (Continued)

Projects dated 11/05/2021: Distributed grants to poor and displaced families and orphans from Idlib countryside (Khan Sheikhoun -Saraqeb and their surroundings) at a value of £50 per family. Number of beneficiary families 60 orphan, poor and displaced families. Distribution of Ramadan meals consisting of (Kabsa rice, bulgur, freekeh - chicken or lamb) to the displaced people living in the camps (Mamdouh Shuaib tents) 42 meals per day throughout the blessed month of Ramadan Number of beneficiary families 42 families. Eid Clothes were distributed to over 40 most needy orphans and Aid was given to an orphans school. Value of projects: £4500. Geographical area: Binnish city and its surrounding areas and Mamdouh Shuaib camp.

Projects dated 13/05/2021: Holding Eid parties and distributing games for orphaned children during the days of Eid in the the city of Binnish-and its surroundings Taoum, Kefra and Foua. The number of orphans benefiting reached 500 children. Project £233.55. Geographical area: Binnish City and its surrounding areas.

Projects dated 19/07/2021: On the occasion of the advent of Eid Al-Adha and the extreme poverty of forcibly displaced families for fear of death, 1 x Aqeeqah and 24 x Sheep were sacrificed and the meat was distributed to poor and forcibly displaced families from Idlib countryside (Khan Sheikhoun Maarat Al-Numan - Saraqeb and the surrounding villages). Number of beneficiary families 350 poor and displaced families. Value of projects: £3000. Geographical area: Binnish City and its surrounding areas.

Projects dated 20/07/2021: More Sheep were sacrificed and the meat was distributed to the orphans and widows living in the city of Binnish on the occasion of the advent of Eid Al-Adha Number of beneficiary families 140 families. Projects: £1000. Geographical area: Binnish City and its surrounding areas.

Projects dated 10/09/2021: Due to the loss of the breadwinner who spends on the house, distributing grants of £50 to the most needy orphans and widows residing in the city of Binnish. Number of beneficiary families 20 families. Project Value: £1000. Geographical area: Binnish City.

Projects dated 21/01/2022: In severe winter, we distributed food packs, warm blankets and oil for heating to the orphans and most needy families whom were forcibly displaced from the South and now residing in Binnish City. The number of beneficiary families reached 20O families. Value projects: £4000. Geographical area: Binnish City.

Projects dated 11/02/2022: Due to the population congestion in the city of Binnish, after the forced displacement of millions of people from Southern Syria due to the war, it was necessary to have a hospital to meet this populations needs, so we help start the construction of a hospital, located in the eastern part of the city of Binnish. Starting Value: £5000. Geographical area: East of Binnish City. Projects in Pakistan / Afghanistan Border Region: Ramadan Aid & Udhiyyah Qurbanis Project:

Projects dated 30/04/2021: In the month of Ramadhan, Food Packs were distributed to the most needy families in the Afghan Refugee camps at the Pakistan / Afghanistan border region. Cost: £2250. Goats & Cows were sacrificed on the occasion of Eid ul Adha and the meat was distributed in the days of Eid ul Adha to the most needy families in the Afghan Refugee camps and at different locations at the Pakistan/Afghanistan border region. Cost of Project: £840.

Projects in Djibouti: Ramadan Iftar/Food Packs & Eid Clothes Distribution & Udhiyyah Qurbanis
World Aid Convoy distributed Iftar Meals and Ramadhan Food Packs "a food pack composed of
(10kg Floor, 10Kg Rise, 5 kg Sugar, 5 L)Oil, 1 kg dates, 1 tin of big milk, 1 tin of juice, 1 carton of
spaghetti), during the holy month of Ramadhan to the most needy families in Djibouti — Cost of
Project = £1530. Eid Gifts and Eid Clothes were distributed to 54 most needy children — Cost of
Project - £470. 20 x Goats and 3 x Cows were sacrificed on the occasion of Eid ul Adha and the meat
was distributed in the days of Eid ul Adha to 80 most needy families in different locations in Djibouti.
Cost of Project - £2250. The distribution took place at different locations inside Djibouti. The most
needy beneficiaries received coupons to come and collect the Food Packs.

Projects in Yemen: Ramadan Iftar/Food Packs & Eif Clothes Distribution & Udhiyyah Qurbanis Ramadhan Food Packs and Iftar Meals were distributed to the orphans and most needy families in Yemen – Cost of Project = £1030. Qurans, Eid Gifts and Eid Clothes were distributed to 20 most needy orphaned children – Cost of Project - £600. 9 x Goats and 6 x Cows were sacrificed on the occasion of Eid ul Adha and the meat was distributed in the days of Eid ul Adha to the most needy families in different locations in Yemen. Cost of Project - £3460. 153 Most needy orphans were given grants of £30 each – Cost of Project - £4600. The distribution took place at different locations in Yemen.

The charity trustees selected for membership are responsible for the general control and management of the charity. World Aid Convoy is constituted as a charitable trust registered with the Charity Commission in February 2014 under charity number 1155899.
