FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2022**

**1. 81<sup>st</sup> Annual General Meeting**

The Society held its 81<sup>st</sup> Annual General Meeting at 6.30pm on Tuesday 22 June 2021 as a virtual event conducted over the digital platform zoom. The President, Mrs Olga Polizzi, addressed the meeting. The Chairman, Richard Northern, then took the Chair. 41 members attended.

The minutes of the previous AGM were approved at the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

The Meeting passed resolutions approving both the Accounts and the Annual Report of the Executive Committee for the year ended 31 March 2021.

Mrs Silvia Pieretti was re-elected Treasurer for 2021-22.

The Treasurer introduced the Society's Accounts, which had been issued separately. Further copies were made available on request from the Society's Secretary.

### 3. Awards and Donations

The Trustees approved the following new donations during 2021-2022:

- (a) a further contribution of £500 to the **Keats-Shelley Memorial Association** in part-sponsorship of the Keats-Shelley Young Romantics Prizes in March 2022.
- (b) A donation of £300 to the **Tricolore Theatre Company** for a joint production with UCL of a tribute to Joseph Grimaldi, *The Clown in Popular Culture*, in March 2022.
- (c) A donation of £500 to the **Literary & Philosophical Society of Newcastle** for a series of celebrations of Dante in December 2021.
- (d) A donation of £500 to **I Musicanti** as a contribution towards the costs of recording Giovanni Bottesini's four quartets to mark the composer's bicentenary in 2021.

The total committed in grants, awards and prizes in 2020-21 amounted to **£2,850**.

### 4. Prizes

The Society sponsored its biennial British-Italian Society Prizes for students of Italian studies at British and Irish universities in 2021. The competition is administered by the Society for Italian Studies (SIS). The prizes were awarded to:

*Italo Calvino in Japan, Japan in Italo Calvino: a Cross-Cultural Encounter*.

Postgraduate Runners-up (£100 each): Dr Anna Lisa Somma, Birmingham University,  
and Dr Maddalena Moretti, Leeds University.

Undergraduate Winner (£250): **Freya Cazalet**, Cambridge University for her dissertation

*The Sleeping Guards: Depictions of the Resurrection in Trecento Italy*.

Undergraduate Runners-up (£50): Isabelle Ragnetti, Kings College, London, and Ella

Powell, Birmingham University.

### TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE ACCOUNTS

Charity law requires the Trustees of the Society to prepare a receipts and payments account and a statement of assets and liabilities for each financial year. In addition, the Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which are sufficient to show and explain the charity's transactions and to disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Society. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities. The trustees have complied with the duty in section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have regard to public benefit guidance published by the Commission.

### TRUSTEES REPORT

The Trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2022.

#### Aims and Objectives

The principal aims of the Society are:

- To increase knowledge and understanding in the United Kingdom of all aspects of Italian culture and of the Italian way of life, including, without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, Italian history, literature, art, music, politics, business, commerce, and the Italian language.
- To disseminate knowledge in those fields by means, inter alia, of lectures, publications, exhibitions, readings, concerts and the like.
- To encourage and to work with other individuals and organisations with similar objectives, in particular by awarding of academic or other prizes in the field of Italian studies broadly construed.
- Where possible and practical, to assist communities in need, whether by reasons of flood, earthquake, or other calamities whatsoever and whether in the United Kingdom or Italy.

The Trustees have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

#### Recruitment and appointment of Trustees

Trustees are recruited from the members of the charity and are elected by the board of Trustees in General meeting for a term of up to 3 years. Trustees are eligible for re-election after expiration of their term of appointment.

#### Activities during the year

The Society ran a full programme of lectures and events during the year, and funded several charitable donations and academic prizes, in addition to publishing the annual Rivista magazine.

#### The Society's Policies

##### Policy on Income Reserves

The Society's running costs usually produce an annual deficit, which is covered by reserves built up through fund-raising events, and by legacies left to the Society. It is the Society's policy to preserve these legacies as intact as possible.


##### Policy on Selection of Investments

The Society aims to maintain the investments which formed the greater part of the legacies bequested as a broadly-based portfolio of high-yielding blue-chip equities, excluding investments in tobacco companies.

##### Policy on Grant Recipients

The Society donates funds in accordance with its stated aims, namely:

1. To increase knowledge and understanding in the United Kingdom of Italy in all its aspects, for example by giving prizes to graduates and undergraduates for essays which raise the profile of Italian studies at British and Irish universities.
2. To assist organisations or persons in need of support for worthwhile cultural initiatives, or in need of help following major natural disasters or other calamities in Great Britain or Italy, by donating funds for relief or recovery.

I report on the accounts of the British Italian Society (Charity no. 253386) for the year ended 31 March 2022, which are set out on pages 4 to 5.

**Respective responsibilities of Trustees and examiner**

The charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's Trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Charities Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- Examine the accounts under section 145 of the Charities Act,
- To follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission (under section 145(5)(b) of the Charities Act), and
- To state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

**Basis of Independent examiner's statement**


My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeking explanations from you as Trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.
