# TRUSTEES REPORT

*This year has been be incredibly fruitful as we navigated the post-lockdown period and return to “normal” life alongside the schools, churches, community and young people in our town and surrounding areas.*

## The Primary Focus for 2021-22

Kingsbridge Youth For Christ has achieved **all of its goals** set out on p5. This is in part due to the cautious nature of the goals. We were keen to not rush ahead into new territory as the whole country was unsure as to whether there would be another lockdown. However we were also very confident that we needed to resume as many of our services as possible to support the young people as restrictions were lifted. It was a difficult time to plan the way ahead, but we took the approach of moving forward, one step at a time.

## Thank You

We are extremely grateful to all our regular financial supporters who enable us to reach the young people in Kingsbridge through our various projects and clubs. Despite the financial implications of multiple national lockdowns, our monthly income through giving remained stable. Although it may not show in this year's accounts, going forward we will be able to dramatically close the gap between income and expenditure due to a new partnership that was formed with a local church just around the year end.

Everything we do; every decision, every lesson, assembly, youth club we run, God slot we deliver is to introduce young people to the real Jesus.

## Mentoring

At the end of March 2021, we resumed our face to face services cautiously. In the local secondary school, our mentoring team supported young people through one-to-one weekly sessions. The sessions were socially distanced at first and we mentored with full PPE. Despite the difficulty of communicating with half of the face covered, our team found there were so many young people who were dealing with issues from being confined to their homes during lockdown. Volatile family situations had turned into pressure cookers. Tensions spilled over, cracks turned into fissures and some of the young people we mentored were dealing with extreme breakdowns in their home lives. Others were crippled with anxiety returning to a space with fifteen hundred other young people after so long in isolation. Some were simply struggling with the idea of a routine again after a year of a far less rigid structure.

In April our team undertook COVID grief counselling training to equip them to support these young people effectively.

As we went in each week, we also found ourselves serving the teachers; sitting, listening and chatting with staff members before and in between mentoring sessions as they tried to process the changes and impact of lockdown.

# TRUSTEES REPORT

Over the year our mentoring team has grown and we now have **five volunteers** who are working in the school. Currently the team are supporting **sixteen young people each week**.

We work with the Senior Leadership Team to determine needs, goals and outcomes of our sessions. Some young people are with us for half a term, others might be with us for the entire year.

Kingsbridge Youth For Christ are not a replacement for NHS and other professional health services, however we have seen some major improvements in the mental health of the students that we see through being a loving, stable, non-judgmental and consistent figure in their lives each week.

In a rural area where local health services are stretched, we are keen to continue delivering and developing our mentoring programme beyond one to one sessions—ideas being discussed include group sessions, cooking lessons, trips to a local gym and guided walks.

## Primary Schools— Assemblies, Lessons, After School Clubs, ETHOS meeting support

Numerous doors have opened for Kingsbridge Youth For Christ in local primary schools—This year we have been invited into three additional primary schools. We are now in **five local primary schools every month** delivering various lessons, assemblies and clubs, being a part of ETHOS and SIAMS meetings to shape the schoolwide delivery of Christian content, as well as being invited to various school events (such as Harvest and Christmas Celebrations) throughout the year.

The school head at Salcombe Primary School formally thanked us this year for our input and in particular, for making Christianity so accessible. This highlights for us the importance of having a presence in the primary schools where there is little to no church engagement within the majority of local primary schools. It is incredibly important to us that the children are introduced to the real Jesus and hear about God's love for them.

The feedback is extremely positive from all of the schools that we have been in this year. We will be continuing our work in the coming year and exploring the idea of a part or full time primary schools worker role. It has become extremely beneficial for the ongoing work of Kingsbridge Youth For Christ as we connect with children in primary school.

## Primary Schools Work—Comments from Pupils

- ‘Jonny and Becky have taught us how to use our Bibles, how to read them and how to make them work for us and to help with our learning’
- ‘We love the Christian games, particularly Jonny with his “magic tricks” They teach us and it’s great we don’t have to write anything, but we still learn.’
- ‘They make God seem real.’ ‘They feel like we are their friends.’
- ‘The children felt they would benefit more time with Jonny and Becky and maybe lower down the school they would get to know them better, but they also said it gave them comfort that they would see them when they get to KCC. They like it also because they are young and very keen and enthusiastic, and they are always very happy and supportive’

## Kingsbridge Youth For Christ in Malborough Primary School—Feedback from Jane Greaves; Chair of Governors, South Hams Federation

“As Foundation Governor and Chair, I have seen the impact of what Jonny and Becky have brought to Malborough school. Jonny and Becky have been coming into school probably for over 4 years now. They both join us in our monthly church service and work with Father Daniel to deliver meaningful stories, thoughts, and ideas to the children, which they are very much engaged with, from the Foundation children aged 4, to the Year 6 children aged 11. They bring another aspect to our monthly services. Jonny and Becky join us regularly and attend special events we hold in school, blessings, assemblies, and other important events. Pre Covid, they ran a very successful after school Youth Club, which the children who attended thoroughly enjoyed, thankfully this has resumed. They also come in and deliver RE lessons and lessons on how to use Bibles that the Year 6 children are presented with at the start of their last year in school, they make these lessons, fun, engaging and hands on, which I have witnessed for myself how much fun they are.

They also come into school in the Summer Term to support the year 6 children into the transition to Kingsbridge Community College, which I know is helpful as I have spoken to several of the children in the village now in Years 7 and 8 who said ‘it made everything feel not so scary” Obviously, we would love to see more of them both in school, but understand they have other commitments. Malborough is part of the South Hams Federation of 5 schools in the area and I know they are both hoping to start working with Loddiswell Primary School, and maybe they could work across the Federation in time. They are both very valued members of our school family.”

## Planting a Youth Club: St. Andrew's Church, East Allington

In September 2021, Kingsbridge Youth For Christ supported St. Andrew's Church in East Allington to plant a youth club in the village. The youth club is running in the village hall and seeing around **fifteen to eighteen young people each week!**

In June 2021, members of the church in East Allington approached Kingsbridge Youth For Christ; they wanted to connect with the young people in their village. There were none in church, where the congregation was small and consisted mainly of older people, but they felt there was a real need in the village. They didn't know how or where to start so contacted Kingsbridge Youth For Christ director, Jonny.

After lots of prayer, St. Andrews pulled together a small team of members from the church. Jonny and Becky initially brought the Kingsbridge Youth For Christ bus to East Allington for the village fete at the beginning of September. There they met lots of the young people and began making some connections.

From then on, Kingsbridge Youth For Christ headed over to East Allington in the bus once a week, and met up with the small team from St. Andrews. They all gathered in the park after school and waited for the young people. There was no indication how many would turn up. Every week the sun was shining and around ten or so young people came out. Games of football, playing ps4, eating lots of sweets...The

response was very positive and within six weeks, enough relationships had been built for the St. Andrews team to take over. Kingsbridge Youth For Christ stepped back, and the youth club in East Allington was formed!

Ruth, the youth club team leader has said they now focus on young people & families one Sunday per month instead of having a formal service, and from October 2021, 15-18 young people in Years 6-8 come along to youth club on a Friday night which is now run by local people from the church.

She was very thankful to Kingsbridge Youth For Christ for their input and encourages others to do the same.

## Kingsbridge Youth For Christ Christian Union

This year we have continued to run the Kingsbridge Youth For Christ CU every Tuesday after school at the KYFC Offices.

In Kingsbridge, there are no youth groups for 11-18 year olds within any of the churches. There are between 0-3 young people in each church. Our Christian Union functions as a weekly youth group for all young Christians in the area; a small community that gathers young people from across the town, surrounding areas and each of these churches to disciple, empower and equip them in their faith. We want young Christians to be connected with each other and build friendship and support one another in their relationship with God where there might usually receive that from a church youth group.

Our young people have lots of questions. "Isn't the Old Testament for then, and the New Testament for now?" "The bible doesn't make sense...the books aren't in order?" "God in the OT seems very different to Jesus in the NT?" Amongst other things this year, we wanted to inspire the young people to see that the scriptures are so rich in teaching and that with a little context and understanding, their relationship with Jesus will transform as they view the bible in a new way.

We have been looking at the timeline of the bible...seeing how God's story fits together, how He reveals his character and nature to us through the scriptures and where we fit into His amazing story. In our bible timeline sessions, the young people split into groups to briefly research a book, finding out key happenings, dates, themes, how it fits into God's story and what it reveals and means for us today. Then, they present back to the rest of the group and fill in an epic timeline with pictures etc.

In December 2021, we had a great time taking the young people from our CU to Plymouth for a Christmas social—crazy golf and a trip to the cinema.

## Kingsbridge Youth For Christ Christmas Stockings

Building on the success of the last year's stockings, we decided to make up another gift for the young people of Kingsbridge this year. We put out a call to local churches and our volunteers, and asked them if they would donate gifts for the stockings. In the end, they were packed full with small gifts, sweets, gloves etc as well as ingredients for bath bombs and other gift ideas they could make for their own family and friends. Also included was another booklet, similar to the TALK booklet from the survival boxes, which gave the same message with a Christmas perspective.

Most of the young people who received a stocking were surprised that there are people in the local churches, who they may never meet, that are regularly praying for them and their futures, and who wanted to give them a gift this Christmas to show them that they care.

We have been praying over this last year for a regular group of girls to come along to The Lounge youth club on Tuesday evenings. It's been really boy-heavy since lockdown lifted. Around this time God answered our prayers with a regular group of girls turning up. We knew a lot of this group of girls already through the mentoring that we do in KCC - some of them really struggle to engage with school and have difficult home lives.

It's been a pleasure to have them in the club, so we gave each of them a stocking too on Tuesday. The look on their faces said it all. "Is that really for me?" one girl said as we handed her the stocking. We gave the other kids at The Lounge a stocking too. Though on the surface they may just be sweets, chocolates, and a few small gifts, they carried such a greater weight and love behind them. Thank you to all who gave—enabling us to give them out and share those moments with the kids that

## SO WHAT'S THE BUS? by Suzy Andrews

*Suzy is one of the Kingsbridge Youth For Christ Trustees - she is also out on Kingsbridge Quay every week with the bus to support local young people with a safe place to hang out—our customised van acts as a mobile youth club; featuring a games console, TV, Sound System, Lights and drink facilities.*

The opposite of the ubiquitous white van that speeds around the lanes...the Kingsbridge Youth for Christ bus is black and stationary....it is a fixture on the Quay on Wednesday and Friday afternoons, come rain or shine. At around 3.30pm a stream of KCC pupils and students amble along, many taking a detour towards the bus where hot chocolate is a staple, sweets an occasional treat, but I think nothing beats a dough ball judging by the recent reaction - think pigeons and Trafalgar Square!

But it's not the hot drinks or the snacks (although they help) which draws the kids to the Bus - it's the reliability and friendliness of Jonny and Becky as they welcome whoever happens to come along. The youngsters are known by name, many will head straight inside to the computer games, others will mill around outside, chatting with the KYFC team or with one another. The attraction, it seems to me, are the familiar faces; the acceptance, the encouragement, the affirmation that Jonny and Becky naturally give them.

I've been struck by just how polite the kids are - I don't know what I was expecting, but they are delightful, admittedly some more monosyllabic than others, but there is a trusted relationship between the kids and Becky and Jonny which has built up over the months and years.

One of the most touching things I've witnessed this year is the way God can be seen to be orchestrating the whole initiative....for example, a youngster that Jonny hadn't seen for ages suddenly pitches up and has a long conversation with Jonny, and when he wanders off, Jonny checks his mobile to see that about the same time the boy arrived, a teacher from the school had sent a message expressing concern about him and to look out for him. The boy has a remarkably unstable family background, but Jonny is a consistent adult in his life who genuinely cares for him. Isn't it a privilege to be able to be Jesus' ambassador in this kingdom?

Relationship-building is the main focus: from there, when trust has been established, deeper conversations can flow. At one session, one of the girls was talking about a funeral and Jonny casually asked the group what they think happens after death. This was the first time these girls had ever opened up to a deeper conversation. There were varied responses... but Jonny doesn't pursue it much further this time - it's left for another time. Instead of jumping in with all things Heaven and Hell, he acknowledges that this is the first step in a much longer conversation that requires spirit-guided nurturing and being sensitive to God's timing. It's not about on the spot Bible-bashing and pushing faith onto the children (there is definitely a time to use our words though!), but reflecting the love of God, His faithfulness towards the teenagers and His care for them.

*The Seaside Parish of Malborough, Salcombe and South Huish want to offer something similar in Salcombe through a partnership with Kingsbridge Youth For Christ - a regular spot where local children can meet Christians from the church, where they know they can gather and be welcomed, not judged, just loved. This is something we are keen to explore in the coming year.*

# FINANCE REPORT

CHRIS ROBERTS, TREASURER

**We, as a charity, are very grateful to our supporters, both individuals and (mainly) local churches for their continued support during a second year of the pandemic, which has again been tough for many charities, particularly as the cost of living has started to rise.**

One way in which this second Covid year differed from its predecessor was that many of KYFC's normal activities were possible, in particular; mentoring in school, youth clubs meeting in person and the KYFC bus could also park on the Quay to meet with young people after school.

## Rising income despite no grants

No grants were awarded this year, local fundraising was limited because of the pandemic, and local events which would normally raise funds for donations to KYFC, did not take place. However, income did rise by over £1,000 partly due to an increase in donations and partly because over £600 was generated by Youth club tuck and subs.

## Rising expenditure due to cost of living increases

From the accounts (see Page 21), expenditure rose by over £2,400 this year. Many of our regular outgoings were costlier, such as bank charges; rent; insurance; fuel insurance and servicing for the bus etc.

## "Special Event" and support

The special event mentioned in the accounts is a Christian youth camp taking place in summer 2022 (after the end of the financial year), but for which booking took place in March and the support for individuals was for Christmas Stockings given out to individual young people, which had proved so popular in 2020-21.

## Annual Contribution to British Youth For Christ

Our annual contribution to British Youth for Christ, formerly allocated to For Other Causes has this year been allocated to Subs and Child Protection. This is because the organisation offers training, guidance and support to KYFC, hence it is more of a subscription than an altruistic donation to another charity.

Unfortunately, their annual conference was cancelled due to Covid, hence training costs were zero this financial year.

The charity shows a loss of approximately £10,850 for the year 2021-2, up nearly £1,300 from 2020-21. Bus depreciation of £3,400 accounts for some of this, but the balance, £7,450, was taken from the charity's reserves. An increase of £475 in tangible assets is for the purchase of second-hand laptop for finance admin and Nintendo Switch for the Youth Club, both of which were replacements for outdated equipment.

**The charity shows a loss of approximately £10,850 for the year 2021-2, The trustees are aware that, In order for the charity's finances to be sustainable, more income needs to be generated. Going forward, a local donor has come forward for 2022-23, which means that there should be no deficit in the year to come.**

Fundraising events to celebrate the charity's 25th anniversary are also planned to boost income and help minimise the shortfall for future financial years. We also hope to attract external grants to support the cost of mentoring in schools.
