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Teme Wheels Report of the Trustees For the period ended 31 March 2022

The Trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law, have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements for the charitable company for the period ended 31 March 2022. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019) but have prepared the accounts on an income and expenditure basis that is permitted for a Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

In early January 2021 there was an urgent requirement for taking people for vaccinations to places such as Leominster, Ludlow, Hereford, Worcester etc. No other organisation in Tenbury could meet the need so several individuals, all of whom were experienced volunteer drivers, informally organised a group to provide transport and a link was made with the Tenbury Surgery. In addition, there was a perceived need to investigate the operation of an electric wheelchair accessible vehicle (WAV) in the rural community which no other charity in Worcestershire was doing.

In order to formalise the group and set up an operational structure for bookings, payments etc. and to protect the drivers and passengers with appropriate insurance, it was decided to form a new charity with the name of Teme Wheels. The charity was registered with the Charity Commission in early March 2021. Membership of the Community Transport Association (CTA) was granted in April 2021.

The formative trustees comprised: J Driver, C Fudge, S Perry, D Reynolds and W Schuster and minutes secretary A Driver. Subsequently, I Little joined the Board.

Accommodation

Initially the administration worked out of volunteers' homes, but the need for an office was quickly recognised and thus an initial arrangement to hire a room at Temeside House over the months of April and May was gut in place. This was followed by the renting and equipping of office premises at 5 Teme Court in June 2021.

Our car transport operations

These essential services remained very busy throughout 2021 with the addition of destinations such as Bromyard and Kington for vaccinations and many other medical destinations ranging from Birmingham to Hereford to Oswestry etc. continue to the present day. By July 2022 registered client numbers had risen to nearly 200 largely because many townspeople already knew our team and were aware of the caring nature of both drivers and administration staff.

The trustees have considered the Charity Commision's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Achievements against objectives

Electric Vehicle

A proposal was written in March 2021 with the aim of introducing a pioneering project to cover the rural areas encompassing the Worcestershire/Hereford/Shropshire borders. Funding for the purchase and initial operation of a WAV was applied for via SpaceHive - a national crowdfunding organisation - and the target of £40,000 was reached in September. Around £20,000 of this was raised from kind donations made by local residents, businesses and our own volunteers; Malvern Hills District Council and Worcestershire County Council kindly contributed to enable the target to be reached. A nine seat Vauxhall E-Vivaro (EVie) was duly purchased, and delivery taken in February 2022. Conversion for wheelchair access took place in May and considerable experience of running the vehicle has been achieved successfully since then. A dedicated charging point hosted by Wyre Pies enabled overnight charging to take place. EVie has proved both economical and very popular with drivers and passengers.

Looking ahead

Already we have instigated a regular shopping service between Tenbury and Cleobury Mortimer with EVie and we anticipate extending such local services in the future; many novel proposals are being considered. Our client base continues to increase and consequently our need to encourage additional volunteer drivers is vital to our future, word of mouth is a very good way of spreading the message!

Chairman's comments

This has been an amazing 'journey' in every sense. We have a fantastic team of volunteers and management and our pioneering work with EVie has attracted national interest from CTA and as far away as Caithness. I wish to place on record my thanks for such a loyal and supportive team and to a substantial number of generous donors.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Significant events

In early January 2021 Teme Wheels was formed to provide help to the local community providing hospital visits, social events and much more.

The Charity's principal sources of funding were from donations and funding from SpaceHive to provide a pioneering electric minibus thus helping the environment. We charge a membership fee to our clients and a cost of either using cars or the electric minibus. We have also received money from

- · Worcestershire County Council and Malvern Hills District Council for concessions (for those clients who own a bus pass)
- · stands at 2 local events

Reserves

We raised £65,027 up to March 2022. Most of the income was from SpaceHive where supporters had uploaded donations. £41,197 was spent purchasing an electric minibus, signage, electric charging apparatus and insurance. The remainder was for office overheads including rent, electricity, telephones, internet, website software and insurance total ng £12,648.

Now we have the minibus we are able to offer more services such as taking groups or organ sations on trips. Also, we have set up Countryside Rides where one or more passengers can enjoy some time out ranging from 1 - 5 hours.

Reserves at 31 March 2022 were £50,750 of which £40,066 was represented by fixed assets, mainly the minibus. The minibus cost £39,044. It has not been depreciated in the accounts as it was not purchased until close to the year end and was not brought into full service until after the year end.

Going concern

It is our policy to try to maintain a balance of unrestricted funds which equates to at least months' unrestricted payments. Unrestricted cash reserves stood at £9,226 at 31 March 2022 and the Trustees are satisfied that this policy is currently met.

1. Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, except for income and expenditure which has been accounted for on cash basis that is permitted for a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, investments which are included at market value and the revaluation of certain fixed assets and in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019), Financial Reporting Standard 102 the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), and the Companies Act 2006.

Teme Wheels meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s).

Going concern

The accounts have ben drafted on the basis that the Charity is a going concern.

Funds

Funds held by the charity are either

Unrestricted income funds are those funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees

Restricted funds are those funds donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities on a cash basis. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income including donations, legacies and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature is recognised when received.

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the statement of financial activities when received.

Income derived from events is recognised when received.

Investment income is recognised when received.

The value of voluntary help received is not included in the accounts.

Donated goods, services and facilities

Donated services and facilities are only included in incoming resources (with an equivalent amount in resources expended) where the benefit to the Charity is reasonably quantifiable, measurable and material. The value placed on these resources is the estimated value to the Charity of the service or facility received.

Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on a cash basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the Charity in the delivery of its activities and services for beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Taxation

The Charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation and any provision for impairment. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following basis. The minibus has not been depreciated in the year because it was acquired close to the year end and was not brought into full service until after the year end.
