GAFSIP endeavours to send end-of-life firefighting equipment and appliances to The Gambia such as personal protective equipment, old fire engines, rescue boats and ancillary operational equipment.

GAFSIP also sends redundant office and educational equipment.

In addition the GAFSIP helps arrange teams of trainers to visit The Gambia to provide vital training needed to keep their fire and ambulance services running.

The provision of fire-fighting equipment to the Gambia Fire & Rescue Service.

The provision of training in respect of fire-fighting –prevention, protection and response.

Cooperation with the Medical Research Council to provide fire safety training.


