The Charity's objects are to develop the work of the Christian church in Basildon and the surrounding area by the advancement of the Christian religion; relief of poverty, suffering, sickness and distress, the advancement of education and other such activities as charitable and in accordance with English law.

- to provide a free hot meal and drink throughout the year, 6 days a week and support to any adult in need, rough sleeper or homeless person.
- to bring a Christian message to primary and junior schools in Basildon, by attending and running assemblies on termly basis.
- d) In partnership with schools, colleges and other local agencies, we work to enhance the safety and emotional well-being of students through caring, listening and helping.

We also provide a forum to share and assist other local Christian organisations or activities in the local area, to help the young, old, vulnerable and those with financial or other needs.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

This year has again been a challenging one, where our normal activities have been curtailed by Covid for part of the year. Despite the difficulties we have been able to continue some of our activities, thanks to the generosity of our supporters and the dedication of our volunteers.

There have been only one joint celebration in the year due to the restrictions.

Our main activities are centred on the homeless and school children. Whist the lockdown and other restrictions has meant that these are not able to function as normal, they do continue.

The support for the homeless (58:7) operated 6 nights a week providing a free hot meal and drink, although because of restrictions this has had to be outdoors and with social distancing for some of the year. Guest numbers varied from 6 to the upper teens. We provided clothes where needed and in the colder months, sleeping bags and tents. The reduction in numbers was due to additional support by the government in housing the homeless, but later in the year numbers coming to 58:7 increased, not from the homeless community but other people who needed our support.

Looking ahead no one knows how rough sleepers and homelessness will develop over the next few years but the local council is committed to supporting the homeless and disadvantaged. We were able to support a new initiative in Basildon with a £20,000 donation to help start a local project run by the Salvation Army to provide accommodation to homeless people in the area.

We are expecting in the long term that there will be fewer rough sleepers than we used to have, but nothing is certain, we have however seen the need for our services being required because of the cost of living crisis.

Our school activities (STM) continued in the period, when we were unable to access the schools because of restrictions, we provided high quality video presentations that were available to schools to use in their assemblies via YouTube. We were able to return to an increased number of schools by the end of the year (22 out of 25 in the area), and expect to return to all schools during the next financial year. This work enables us to reach 10,000 children plus teachers each half term which a Christian based message at their assemblies.

Our School Pastors activities were curtailed for some of the year, but we currently volunteer in one local school to support both pupils, staff and parents.

We remain grateful for the support of the churches and volunteers who support and finance the work of CTB.
