

All Trustees are appointed by virtue of their office in Guildford Lions Club CIO, as elected annually by the members of the Club in accordance with the terms of the Club's Constitution and By-Laws.

The Club was previously governed as a Charity Trust Fund (Regn. No. 1083404) and converted to a CIO, which became operational July 1st 2018. Funds from the previous charity were transferred to the CIO as at that date.

The Club is an autonomous body within Lions Clubs International, and any use of the Club funds is approved by a simple majority of attendees at Club meetings and ratified by a quorum of Trustees.

The Club ensures that all activities are correctly managed and risk assessments are completed for all major events. The Treasurer reviews the financial risk assessment of each event and reports accordingly to the Trustees. A contingency sum is held in reserve to minimise any risk to the Club from fundraising activities.

Officers' and Trustees' training is provided at Lions Club International Spring Forum and training days.

# Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The Club is established to carry out any charitable purpose for the benefit of any individual or group of people, or for other organisations established for charitable purposes.

In 2021/22 the Club organised two major outdoor fundraising events. Namely Guildford Firework Fiesta, and Music in the Park. Online talks and competitions also continued to be used as a means of generating income but to a lesser extent than the previous year. In addition, collections at Christmas provided a useful contribution to the Club's fundraising activities.

A summary of the types of beneficiaries of these funds is shown in Section D below.

In deciding on these activities, and on how the resultant funds were expended, the Trustees had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on the necessity for these activities to be for the public benefit.

The Club supplied eggs and fresh vegetables to two foodbanks at a total cost of £4242 during the year.

Our annual Christmas appeal helped us fund 250 supermarket vouchers at £20 each we were distributed to those in need.

All Club members and volunteers give their time completely free of charge.

Members are permitted to claim transport mileage costs @ £0.45p per mile whilst using personal transport on Club fundraising or charitable activities

Members donations to the Club and member-only raffles cover all administrative costs of running the Club.

The Club has no paid employees, and no salary or fees have been paid directly or indirectly out of the funds of the Club to any trustee or to any person known to be connected with any of them.

Thus 100% of all public donations received by the Club are used for charitable causes, together with all profits generated by Club fund raising events.

# Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

With the easing of restrictions imposed by the pandemic the Club was able to reintroduce two of its major outdoor events being Music in the Park and the Guildford Fireworks Flesta. These two events produced a nett income of £39,000 for the Club thus increasing the level of funding available to support the worthy causes.

On-line fundraising activities, donations, members contributions added to the overall income which was substantially up on the previous year.

From this income the club was able to cover the cost of the events, manage its affairs and provide £35,513 support to local individuals in need of help plus local charities and international appeals through the Lions Clubs Foundation.

Major beneficiaries of our support during the year included foodbanks, Sea Cadets Guildford Action and Cherry Trees.

In addition to the above expenditure sufficient funds were retained to provide the next financial year with a working balance to ensure our normal activities are able to continue. In particular the Club retains the financial strength to enable major fundraising activities to be undertaken.

The Club also promoted and supported the Lions Message in a Bottle scheme through various local surgeries and other organisations.

The Club holds a contingency sum of £7,500 in reserves to provide support for its activities. This sum is held in order to cover unexpected contingencies, such as an event making a loss. The contingency sum was temporarily increased to £12,000 for the Guildford Fireworks event as an additional precaution.

The fund was not called upon this year.
