Para 1.20	We achieved our objective of supporting women and families living in poverty by providing a mobile food bank service to alleviate their hardship. The culturally appropriate Food Bank delivered food parcels to women and families in need. Some women also accessed food parcels by attending our weekly Food Distribution Day. We supported about 30 women with food parcels every week.
		Without this support, many women would have been without their traditional food. Also, through the Food Bank, women had the opportunity to meet their neighbours and some lasting friendships were formed, thereby reducing loneliness and isolation.
		The key work sessions helped to facilitate personal growth and development for the women. It supported them in planning for the future with a view to coming off benefits. Consequently, this will reduce the pressure on the benefits systems. The sessions also improved the mental well-being of women.
		Our Cooking Club equips beneficiaries with the skills to cook and eat healthily for life. Beneficiaries learn how to prepare healthy meals on a small budget. The cooking sessions provides opportunities for women from different ethnic backgrounds to meet and interact, thereby reducing isolation and loneliness.
		The Community Engagement day allowed women to come together to discuss
