#### ACTIVITIES WERE RESTRICTED DUE TO THE COVID PANDEMIC

- 1. Citizenship: The trustees have maintained the projects covering Lions Clubs International 'Young leaders in Service (YLIS), and the support for local Brownies and other youth organisations.
- Promoting the Voluntary Sector: The development of relationships with local authorities, agencies and other charitable organisations has continued and the fund raising and community service activities have been maintained. This is aimed at co-operation at service events and to enable grants to other charities and individuals.
- 3. Promoting Volunteering: Recruitment of new members, supporters and volunteers has continued with new members being attracted.
- 4. Relief of Poverty: This has been mainly achieved though individual hardship grants and a grant to the John Foyles Charity.
