Additionally, volunteers have gathered tools and equipment, applied for grants, and held meetings with a wide range of individuals and agencies.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.	Para 1.20	Construction started on site in early April 2021 while there were still some restrictions due to the Covid Pandemic. By the end of the period in April 2022 we had a steel building with internal walls and electrics and plumbing. The build was not without its complications, not least the main contractor declaring bankruptcy just before their final payment was due. This led to a period of uncertainty as the snagging items needed to be resolved by new contractors and costs continued to rise. The solar panels were installed thanks to a grant from Awards for All and
		more equipment was purchased as well as donations of old tools continuing to be handed in and

	collected by volunteers. A new group of skilled volunteers was gathered, and they contributed both to the fitting out and to helping with the administration of the workshop. At the end of this reporting period, we weren't yet able to open formally and start recruiting members, but we do have a major new asset for Kingswood and Hazel Leys and Corby which will make a difference in the years ahead.

We have made excellent progress on this front though rising prices caused by the Covid Pandemic and Brexit have strained our finances. The charity continues to seek grant funding and once the shed is fully up and running, we will have a clear idea of the sums needed to keep it open. Very sadly a few months after this reporting period our Chair, Brian Dunn, died suddenly in August. John Whiteford stepped up as chair and signs this report.
