Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

With the renovated hall completed, we have been able to run a full calendar of activities. The village hall has proven to be a popular and valuable venue with 157 uses in the last 1-year period. This includes weekly yoga and toddler groups, plus the recent addition of Pilates. In addition to these we also have the monthly book club, gardening club, Parish Council Meetings, and the community café / lunch club.

Although the amazing extension of the hall is the most visible change, there have also been some new developments this year to improve the hall experience and make it a more desirable venue. Firstly, a new audiovisual system has been installed with a high-definition projector and audio loop capable of connecting to medical aids for those with impaired hearing. Secondly, sound dampening panels have been installed to improve the acoustics of the hall.

The village hall has also proven to be a great asset when supporting the Milton End Solar Farm groups. Similar to previous years we have also run a number of very popular one-off events such as the Christmas Fair, John Burcher's village history talk, Stroud Auctions talk & valuation, Indoor Kurling, a Macmillan coffee morning, and the high energy Samba drumming class. One other event of importance was the opening for the funeral service for Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. It was important to allow those who wanted to share their grief and celebrate the amazing like of our Queen.

Additionally, in consultation with Stroud District Council, the hall agreed to open on request as a warm space on designated days if needed.

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

Total cash holdings at 30 June 2022 were £18427, creditors £999 and debtors £50.

All planned renovations are complete so reserves are now being built back up to fund future projects and renovations to the hall and to the adjoined house which provides the primary income source for the charity. The Trustees therefore believe the charity is in a strong position to continue operation of the hall after the development is complete and Coronavirus restrictions allow.

Rental income resumed in September 2021 when the house was relet following extensive renovations.

A primary aim is to maximise use of the hall by the community, partially by ensuring hire rates remain competitive but also realistic with regard to increasing overheads, primarily electricity costs.

However the trustees do not consider it necessary that all operating costs should be covered by non-rental income; rental income is not designated for specific purposes.
