Annual Report for the Year ended 30 June 2019

General Information

Independent Examiner

The Independent Examiner is Christopher Kirk, a retired accountant.

Objects, Organisation and Activities

The Charity aims to advance education and training in the agricultural, horticultural and related industries.

Review of Progress and Achievements

Membership continues at just over 90. Overall incoming resources before interest income, i.e. membership fees and course fees, grew by 21% over the previous year. Course fees grew by 10% while BASIS / Facts income grew by an excellent 39%. Costs were contained to a rise of 13% on these increased activity levels. Operations continue stable and the Charity recorded a surplus of £23,270 (2018 - £10,177) in the year bringing the level of financial reserves up to £201,602 (2018 - £178,322).

Annual Report for the Year ended 30 June 2019 (Cont'd)

Policy on Reserves

Given the lack of grant income and the variability of farmers' financial positions between years and the affordability therefore of adequate training, the Trustees consider it prudent to maintain a level of reserves comparable to the annual incoming resources.

Notes to the Accounts for the Year ended 30 June 2019

1. Accounting Policies

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Charity Commission's Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) and the Charities Acts 2006 and 2011.

2. Depreciation

The Charity does not account for depreciation, as the costs of the few assets which it holds are written off as expenditure in the year of purchase. Purchases of fixed assets in the year were \pounds nil (2018 - \pounds nil).

3. Trustees' Remuneration and Expenses

The Treasurer and the Secretary were the only Trustees to be paid for services rendered to the Charity. In the case of the Secretary, the remuneration includes for services rendered as Training Officer and for conducting courses in agronomy. Their aggregate remuneration in the year was £30,344 (2018 - £26,207).

Two Trustees received reimbursement for reasonable and proper expenses incurred on business for the Charity. The aggregate expenses incurred were £3,363 (2018 - £3,439) and related to mileage, postage, stationery, telephone and other office costs.

4. Other Costs

Other costs in the year amounted to £29,666 (2018 - £29,417) and comprised mainly the costs of room hire and refreshments for courses; registration and assessment fees to BASIS and other training organisations, and insurance premiums.
