### Chairman's Report for period June 2021 to June2022

The 12 month period ending June 2022 saw the Trust, its Constituted and Associated Members gradually emerging from the Covid 19 pandemic which had restricted activities since March 2020.

All clubs experienced a decline in membership during the various lockdown periods which in turn reflected individual club's finances, but numbers were now show signs of recovery.

Previously secured Government Covid financial support (2020/2021) helped to support basic services and routine maintenance during 2021 / 2022 allowing the budget set aside by the Rugby Club, and held by the Trust to refurbish areas of the Club House, to remain partly intact, although the original plans had to be scaled down.

To reduce running costs the aging central heating and hot water boilers were replaced with more efficient units with more effective controls. A move towards greater use of LED light was also progressed. The original floodlights on the Rugby Club training pitch were replaced with LED units.

Highlight of 2021 was the Centenary of Sutton Coldfield Rugby Football Club in August 2021, followed by a Centenary dinner in March the following year, attended by local dignitaries.

A notable event at the beginning of 2022 was the announcement by Sutton Coldfield Bridge Club that they were considering leaving the Trust to become an associated member rather than a constituted member. Negotiations continued for the remainder of the year to facilitate the Bridge Club's departure.

As always volunteers are hard to come by, which in one incidence resulted in the Trust being forced to seek professional support to oversee the Trust finances.

The Trust is pleased to report that it remains in a sound condition and continues to support the local clubs and community groups.
