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Trustees' Report for the Year Ended 30 June 2022

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2022. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives

The objects of the Society shall be to improve, educate and cultivate the public taste in Musical Theatre, aiming to:

- (a) Encourage the study of, and undertake the performance of, Musical Theatre in any of its forms.
- (b) Produce Musical theatre, ranging from Light Entertainment to more Dramatic Works and stimulate and create new innovation.
- (c) Assist and further such charitable institutions and purposes as the Management Committee may from time to time determine.

Activities

In relation to these purposes Aldridge Musical Comedy Society stages two major shows during each year, and occasional smaller concerts at OAP homes, local fairs/carnivals and other events.

Membership of the society is open to any member of the public; those for whom the cost of membership is prohibitive may have their membership fees waived at the discretion of the Management Committee (Trustees).

Acting members are selected by simple singing audition; anyone not passing the audition may become a non-acting member and help front of house and/or back stage.

Performing shows benefits acting members by improving their knowledge and understanding of a wide variety of musical theatre genres, developing their skills in acting, singing and dancing, and improving their physical and mental wellbeing.

Non-acting members can improve their skills and experience in technical aspects of theatre including lighting, stage management, costume and makeup and customer service as well as team working.

Audiences, made up of any members of the general public who purchase tickets, benefit from an increased appreciation and enjoyment of the musical theatre repertoire and gain access to musical theatre for a lower price and in venues more local to their homes than professional companies can provide.

Social investments

Where feasible, Aldridge Musical Comedy Society has used funds in the past and present to support Keeling School of Dance where rehearsals are held and the Prince of Wales Theatre where shows are performed.

Volunteers

Volunteers can make contributions through being non-acting members or patrons for the society, in which they receive benefits in exchange for a monetary membership. Trustees are volunteers who are elected to committee at the AGM. Volunteers also provide rehearsal refreshments, and backstage and front of house services for shows.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Aldridge Musical Comedy Society endeavours to put on two shows a year through its members and volunteers. Bi-weekly rehearsals for 50 weeks of the year provides its members and volunteers with social interaction and personal wellbeing and mental nourishment. In particular we were one of the first local societies to restore productions after COVID by holding rehearsals outdoors and socially distanced. By supporting its members alongside the services it uses such as Keeling School of Dance, the Prince of Wales Theatre and using its reach to advertise local business and opportunities for all abilities allows it to support the local area and provide safe spaces for those wanting to express themselves.

Aldridge Musical Comedy Society managed to host two successful shows in 21/22, Sister Act and Cinderella, bringing in important funding for future shows and showcasing cast talents

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Fundraising activities

Although fundraising was difficult due to lasting effects of the Coronavirus outbreak, Aldridge Musical Comedy Society still managed to host social events and performances to raise funds for the Society

Investment performance

Investment performance was lower than previous years due to the Coronavirus outbreak and dependence on social events for investment.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The accounts show income for the year to have totalled £31,269.

Expenditure fo the year totalled £30,962 resulting in a net surplus of income over expenditure for the year of £307 (£663 Deficit :2021)

Total unrestricted funds held by the charity increased over the year under review from £22,699 to £23,006.

Principal funding sources

The charity's principal sources of funding are from membership income, sales relating to performances (Tickets, programmes, raffle) and social events for fundraising

Reserves policy

Reserves are held by the society in order to fund future shows, mitigate against risk of abandonment and to purchase fixed assets and sundries for the use of the Society (e.g. Keyboard, sound equipment, props and costume items, advertising banners). They may also be used for the benefit of members in arranging professional workshops on singing, dancing etc.

Principal risks

Effects of the Coronavirus outbreak on theatre performance attendances and continued support by members in rehearsal and membership status

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Organisational structure

Trustees elected into a committee, lead by a Chairman but supported on all areas by each other. Roles of importance voted on a per trustee basis and approval from society members and patrons.

Wider network

Aldridge Musical Comedy Society is a member of the Arts Council for Cannock Chase, where it performs its shows. It is also a member of the National Operatic and Dramatic Association (NODA)

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
