# Independent Examiners' report to the trustees on the unaudited financial statements of Newquay Dramatic Society

#### PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

#### for the year ended 31st October 2022

Earlier this year we unveiled a plaque honouring the late Eileen Pollard who was instrumental in acquiring the old Lane Village Hall as an ideal venue for a proposed new home for Newquay Amateur Dramatic Society. Various sites around the town were considered but the availability of on-site parking facilities has proven to be of immense value to the long-term success of the charity.
