

- Use reasonable care and skill in their work as trustees, using their personal skills and experience as needed to ensure that the charity is well-run and efficient.
- Consider getting external professional advice on all matters where there may be material risk to the charity, or where the trustees may be in breach of their duties.

All trustees, however appointed, must act in the charity's interests, and must not represent the interests of any outside organisation or their own personal interests.

Trustees value professional and personal development for both Trustees and Volunteers. New trustees and Staff, including volunteers are given induction regarding the charity policies and working document.
