Specifically, the objects of the charity are to advance the education of the pupils of the school by providing and assisting in the provision of facilities for education at the school (not normally provided by the local education authority) and in furtherance of this object may: (a) foster more extended relationships between the staff, parents and others associated with the school, and (b) engage in activities which support the school and advance the education of the pupils attending it.

Our big events were a Christmas Fair which raised £6,801, Summer Fair which raised £7,399 and two Balls which raised £2,200 and £2,911 each. (The numbers are all profit figures). In addition to the amounts received from raising activities, a total of £3,617 was received through matched funding programmes of parents' workplaces. During the year the charity awarded grants for additional sports coaching and classroom allowances for the teachers. In addition, the charity gave £1,722 for new playground equipment and spent £3,835 to repair the gazebo.
