Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	Para 1.17	<p>OUR AIMS</p> <p>2:52 Challenge operates under a Constitution of a Charitable Incorporated Organisation whose only voting members are the charity trustees dated 25 July 2016 and was sealed by the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales on 30 May 2017.</p> <p>The objects of the charity are to advance the Christian faith for the benefit of the public, especially young people under 25 years, in accordance with the 2:52 Challenge statement of belief, to advance in life and relieve the needs of people, especially young people and to promote the education (including social and physical training) of people including those under the age of 25 years.</p> <p>We aim, to provide weekly, educational, free-time activities based on Christian principles. And to provide travel opportunities that embeds learning and develops new skills through Soapbox Trips. Through our 2:52 Challenge programme we aim to develop life skills, healthy living, Christian spiritual growth and citizenship, building self-confidence and a desire to contribute to the wider community. 		<p>Due to the ongoing effects of the COVID-19 pandemic we have been unable to restart our groups and many of the young people have moved on. We have continued to informally support those young people that have remained by meeting outside for exercise and restating our aims through our conversations.</p> <p>Develop the overseas mission element of 2:52 Challenge (Soapbox Trips) Following the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions we were able to host two trips, One to Bolivia in January 2022 and one to Zambia in July/August 2022.</p>



