

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The PCC is a public benefit entity within the meaning of FRS102. The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011 in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 governing the individual accounts of PCCs with the Regulations' "True and fair view" provisions and applicable accounting standards and the 2016 version of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP(FRS102)).

ASSETS

Consecrated and benefice property

In so far as consecrated and benefice property of any kind is excluded from the statutory definition of 'charity' by Section 10(2) (a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011 such assets are not capitalised in the financial statements.

Moveable church furnishings

These are capitalised at cost and depreciated over their useful economic life other then where insufficient cost information is available. In this case the item is not capitalised, but all items are included in the Church's inventory.

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least £2,000 each. They are valued at cost or else, for gifts-in-kind, at a reasonable estimate of their open market on receipt.

Depreciation is calculated to write off the capitalised cost of fixed assets over their estimated useful lives depending on the type of asset as follows:

Office equipment 5 years

Land and buildings - the PCC adopts the policy regarding the clergy house (temporarily let) at 95 Evelyn Road,
Dunstable of accounting at 'current market value' based on valuations within the last 3 years.

Investments

Investments quoted on a recognised stock exchange or whose value derives from them are valued at market value at the year end.

Short term deposits

These are the cash held deposits either with the CCLA or at the bank.

FUNDS

Unrestricted Funds

These represent the remaining income funds of the PCC that are available for spending on the general purposes of the PCC, including amounts designated by the PCC for fixed assets for its own use or for spending on a future project and which are therefore not included in it's 'free reserves' as disclosed in the trustees report.

Restricted Funds

These are income funds that must be spent on restricted purposes and details of the funds held and restrictions provided are shown in the notes to the accounts.

Endowment Funds

These are restricted funds that must be retained as trust capital either permanently or subject to a discretionary power to spend capital as income, and where the use of any income or any other benefit derived from the capital may be restricted or unrestricted. Full details are shown in the notes to the accounts

6 FIXED ASSETS (Continued)

Functional charitable land and buildings are not included in the balance sheet. This comprises the Priory Church Hall which has a valuation of approximately £200,000 (1997), The land was acquired by deed of grant from The Crown Estate in 1839 to be used as a school and later in 1923 the use was changed to that of church and similar meetings. Should this change, outside those permitted by the grants, there would be a right of re-entry to the Crown Estate. Therefore no commercial gain would be realised.

ANNUAL REPORT TO THE CHARITY COMMISSIONERS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

Aim and Purposes

The primary object of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) is the promotion of the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to the doctrines and practices of the Church of England. The statutory function of the PCC is to co-operate with its ministers in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish of Dunstable the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical.

Objectives and activities

The PCC is committed to enabling as many people as possible to join in worship and mission and to become part of our parish community. The PCC maintains an overview of worship and mission throughout the parish and makes suggestions on how activities can reach and involve people throughout the parish and beyond. Worship puts faith into practice through prayer and scripture, music and sacrament.

When planning activities in 2022, the PCC considered the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit and in particular the guidance on charities seeking the advancement of religion. Primarily, the PCC tried to help ordinary people to live out their faith as part of our parish community, with activity that addressed this need through:

- Worship and prayer
- Pastoral care and support for people living in the Parish
- Mission and outreach work

To facilitate the activities, it was and is important to maintain the fabric of the church buildings and premises for which the PCC is responsible.

Achievements and Performance

Worship and prayer

The PCC worked to support as many people as possible to worship at our churches and to become part of the Parish community in Dunstable. The PCC maintained an overview of worship throughout the Parish and looked to improve on how our services could involve the many communities and groups that live within the Parish. Our services and worship put faith into practice through prayer, scripture, music and sacrament.

All three churches also continued to offer online worship. Newsletters and social media enabled contact to continue and new contacts to be made, helping the PCC to fulfil its objectives in new ways and changing circumstances.

In July, the Bishop of Bedford led a service at which the Revd Jenna Dearden and three other curates were ordained as priests – believed to have been the first ordination service held in the Parish, at least since the Reformation.

Other large services were hosted for external organisations, including a service for the Mrs Jane Cart Trust (October) and a service for the Road Victims Trust (November).

Pastoral care and support for people living in the Parish

In 2022 the clergy conducted occasional offices for those living in the Parish, or connected with it:

During 2022 a large number of asylum-seekers moved into a hotel in the Parish, and many joined the congregation at St Augustine's church; in November, 21 of them were baptized (17 adults and four children). With increasing numbers of asylum seekers moving into the Parish, the PCC decided in 2022 to focus on ministry amongst asylum seekers as an area to develop mission as a parish, across all three churches.

Mission and outreach

St Augustine's church continued to host Dunstable Foodbank. The Revd Tim Davis continued to provide chaplaincy services to two local secondary school academies.

All three churches continued to let their halls to external users, raising income and strengthening links with the local community.

In June, all three churches held events celebrating the Platinum Jubilee of HM Queen Elizabeth II, taking the opportunity to engage with the local community and other community groups. A special service in the Priory Church was attended by the Town Mayor and visitors from Dunstable's twin town, Porz in Germany.

In September, following the death of HM Queen Elizabeth II, all three churches were made available to large numbers of visitors who came to light candles and sign books of condolence. The Priory Church hosted a commemorative service led by the Bishop of Bedford and attended by the Lord Lleutenant of Bedfordshire, the High Sheriff of Bedfordshire, the Mayor of Dunstable, other civic dignitaries, representatives of other churches and community groups and organisations.

Adults and young people involved in the churches' worship and activities are encouraged to join the Parish Electoral Roll and vote for churchwardens and officers of the PCC and DCCs. As at the annual meeting in March 2022, the number on the Electoral Roll was 207, an overall increase of 9 from 2021, distributed as follows:

St Augustine 56
St Fremund 27
Priory Church of St Peter 124

Premises and fabric

In July, the Priory Church replaced most of its chairs with around 200 new stackable wooden chairs, bought with the help of generous grants. Work also began on repairing and restoring the historic organ, 40 years after the last major restoration work.

The Priory Church hall was redecorated and at St Fremund's Church the garage was converted into storage space.

Structure, governance and management

The Parish of Dunstable is part of the Diocese of St Albans in the Church of England. It comprises the PCC and the three District Church Councils (DCCs) of the Priory Church of St Peter, St Augustine of Canterbury and St Fremund the Martyr.

The ordained staff in 2022 comprised Team Rector, the Revd Rachel Phillips, Team Vicars the Revd Ricky Turner and the Revd Tim Davis, and Assistant Curate the Revd Jenna Dearden.

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. PCC members include the clergy and churchwardens; representatives to the deanery and diocesan synods; and members elected by those members of the congregation who are on the electoral roll of the parish. All those who attend our services are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCC.

The PCC members are responsible for making decisions on all matters of general concern and importance to the parish including deciding on how the funds of the PCC are to be spent. The full PCC held four ordinary meetings during the year, receiving reports from the churchwardens of the three churches and the deanery synod and discussing matters for which the PCC is responsible, including finance, safeguarding, health & safety and data protection. The meeting in October was attended by the Bishop of Bedford, who led a Bible study and discussion about mission. There were a further four meetings of the PCC's Standing/Finance Committee. The Annual Parish Church Meeting was held on 20 March 2022 in the Priory Church, to approve the accounts and various reports for 2021, together with elections of PCC members.

Safeguarding

Throughout the year, the PCC complied with the duty under section 5 of the Safeguarding and Clergy Discipline Measure 2016 (duty to have regard to House of Bishops' guidance on safeguarding children and vulnerable adults).

The PCC remains thankful to the large number of volunteers who give generously of their time and talents, supporting mission and growth throughout the Parish.

Financial review

The PCC Treasurer co-ordinated the volunteer treasurers of the three DCC's and to ensure that financial records were maintained for the preparation of annual accounts for the individual churches and the consolidated accounts for the Parish.

The net Parish assets decreased by £48 to £718,502 (2021: £718,550) with £76,775 of income from a very generous legacy, and £70,040 relating to exceptional maintenance items referred to below.

Total income of all funds for the year was £324,552 which increased by £109,838 from £214,714 in 2021. This was made up as follows:

- Legacies were £76,775 for the year which was £66,177 higher than 2021
 - The legacy is restricted to 40% for music at St Peter (£30,710),
 - 60% for other purposes at St Peter (£46,065)
- Grants received were £27,085, up from 2021 by £6,427. £8,643 was received to offset the cost relating to the replacement chairs, £10,050 related to council grants to support lost hall hire at the 3 churches, and £3,838 of energy grants.
- The total of all donations and tax recovered was £121,284, up by £6,162
- Open plate collections were £6,875 higher than 2021
- Hall hire was up by £18,466 at £38,636
- Fund raising increased by £4,384 to £6,856

Total expenditure of all funds for the year was £319,203 an increase of £34,869 on 2021 although last year included exceptional costs relating to Chew's House and Evelyn Road of £32,141 meaning a real increase of £67,010. This includes exceptional budgeted items for £48,515 relating to replacement chairs at St Peter from the 20/20 Fund and £21,525 for the ongoing Organ repairs.

Excluding the exceptional items in each year, the regular costs decreased by £3,030. The key changes were £4,130 reduction in staff costs relating to music, £6,643 increase in running costs caused by the increase in energy prices but also the increased usage of the buildings this year. Upkeep of services were up £4,543 including £3,303 being spent at St Peter for upgrading the Wi-fi. There was a reduction of £4,270 due to PCC office set up costs last year

Of the total, income for unrestricted funds was £229,784 of which £163,157 came from voluntary income including planned giving of gift aid donations, income tax recoverable, other planned giving, sundry donations, chaplaincy contributions, grants and legacies. Church activities included £38,636 for hall lettings and £11,584 fees received for weddings and funerals. Fund raising brought in £6,856 and rental income from the freehold property £7,200.

Expenditure on unrestricted funds was £259,144 of which the major cost was £154,148 being the Parish's quota contribution to the Diocese of St Albans. Other expenditure incurred was £18,119 for Staff Costs, £21,525 for Organ repairs, £37,092 for church running, maintenance and upkeep of services, £15,305 for church halls running/maintenance costs.

Restricted funds income of £93,670 were £11,893 of grants, £76,775 from the legacy and £3,915 from the sale of the old chairs at St Peter.

Net movement on Parish funds, after fund transfers and investment gains, is summarised as follows:

Reserves carried forward at 31 December 2022 for unrestricted funds for general purposes were £447,534 of which £61,470 had been allocated for sub-groups and designated funds, leaving a net balance of £386,064. Fixed assets account for £325,715 of this, leaving current assets of £60,349. It should be noted that fixed assets include a current selling valuation of £320,000 for the clergy house at 95 Evelyn Road, Dunstable which is the curate's residence.
