Christ Central Workington Trustees Report

Trust information

Details of trustees and other information are set out on pages 1 & 2 and form part of this report. This report and accounts cover the period 16 November 2021 to 31 December 2022.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is governed by a constitution with trust deed dated 15 August 2021. The charity has a Council comprising the trustees. New trustees are elected by the Council.

In 2022 there were two part-time employees (not trustees) and several volunteers.

The charity is in fellowship with Christ Central Churches Worldwide, which is linked to Newfrontiers International Trust Ltd,. Christ Central Workington is part of Churches Together in Workington & District, which is then part of Churches Together in Cumbria, and is also part of the Evangelical Alliance.

Objectives and activities

The objects are for the benefit of the public in such ways and in such parts of the UK or the world as the Charity Trustees from time to time may think fit (1) to advance the Christian faith in accordance with the Statement of Faith, (2) to relieve sickness and financial hardship and to promote and preserve good health by provision of funds, goods or services or support of any kind.

The Charity Trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and, in particular, the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion when exercising any powers or duties to which the guidance is relevant.

Christ Central Workington operates and maintains the Bridge Centre in Central Square, Workington, providing a place for worship, making facilities available for other community activities, including providing the Workington distribution centre for the North Lakes Foodbank.

Reserves

The charity has a policy on reserves, covering 6 months operating costs, review and termination/windup considerations. At 31 December 2022, the charity held funds of £74,452 that will cover operating costs and

- payment of further employment, as required
- specific projects either in the community or abroad
- · building maintenance and repairs contingencies
