Street Pastors Newcastle operates as part of a national network of Street Pastor organisations under license from the Ascension Trust, a company limited by guarantee, registered at Alpha House, 158 Garth Road, Morden, London, SM4 4TQ.

The following policies and procedures are provided to each new charity trustee

 Newcastle Upon Tyne Street Pastors Constitution October 2009 (Reviewed February 2014).

The Six Trustees form the Management Committee. The Trustees formally meet a minimum of four times a year. All Trustees give their time voluntary and received no remuneration or other benefits during the year.

A Street Pastor Co-ordinator is employed for three days a week. The principal roles and responsibilities of the Co-ordinator is to recruit and organise training for new SPs, liaise with current SPs to resource weekly patrols, to assist in the development of working protocols with the police, the local council and other agencies, to speak on the work of Street Pastors to other organisations and to fund-raise for the work of Street Pastors. An integral part of the role is to regularly brief the Management Committee on the work and development of the initiative within the area and to ensure that the Management Committee comply with charity law, the Licence Agreement and the various Street Pastors' policies, procedures and guidelines.

A Treasurer supports the work of NSP. Responsibilities include banking of receipts and organising payments, producing monthly management reports, preparing and submitting Gift Aid claims, preparing an annual report for presentation at the Annual General Meeting, and the submitting an Annual Return for the Charity Commission. Fund raising research is also undertaken.

Street Pastors Newcastle work in partnership with the following

- Newcastle City Council, by signposting vulnerable persons to Changing lives, Housing Advice, Children's Services and Domestic Violence.
- Newcastle City Council: working/updating the Rough sleeper Coordinator.
- Northumbria Police, in strategic planning for the night time economy and other ad hoc events.
- Northumbria Police, by releasing resources for more pressurised matters.
- The Ambulance Service, by providing basic first aid, thus reducing ambulance calls.
- St John's Ambulance / FSNE by offering frontline first aid and working in their Mobile Medical Unit located in the city centre.
- Licenses premises/door staff and hoteliers, by caring for vulnerable people entering or leaving their premises.
- Changing Lives, by referring the homeless to their Outreach Team.
- St Nicolas' Cathedral, who provide a city centre office space and an operational base.
- Nexus Metro patrols in and around Newcastle, including Haymarket
 & Eldon Square Bus Stations.

The objects of the Street Pastors Newcastle as set out in the 2009 Constitution and reviewed in 2014 are

 To advance education in accordance with Christian principles by such means as the Management Committee may consider appropriate in Newcastle upon Tyne and in such other parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Management Committee may from time to time think fit and to fulfil such other purposes which are exclusively charitable according to the law of England and Wales and are connected with the charitable work of the Charity.

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

- To relieve sickness and financial hardship and to promote and preserve good health by the provision of funds goods or services of any kind including through the provision of counselling and support in Newcastle upon Tyne and in such other parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Management Committee may from time to time think fit.
- To advance the Christian Faith in accordance with the License Agreement executed with Ascension Trust and the Core Values and Mission Statement appearing in the Schedule hereto in Newcastle upon Tyne and in such other parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Management Committee may from time to time think fit particularly but not exclusively by means of caring, listening and helping people on the streets and at various venues day and night.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

Patrols take place each week in the centre of Newcastle on a Friday and Saturday between 10.15 p.m. and 4.00 a.m. Between 10:15 pm & 11:30 pm the team Patrols the 5 Metro stations and two bus stations in Newcastle travelling on the Metro. Additional evenings are arranged for specific nights or 'risk nights', e.g. New Year's Eve, Fresher's Week.

During the patrols, Street Pastors respond to the needs of members of the public. Needs are varied ranging from, caring for those who are incapacitated through drugs, alcohol or both; men or women separated from friends; those who are sleeping rough, are cold, hungry, and thirsty; those without suitable footwear and those who just need directions to their hotels.

Health and safety is improved by the provision of flip flops, hydration in the provision of bottles of water, energy by providing confectionery, warmth in the provision of space blankets and small items of clothing and recharging facilities for mobile phones to help with communication. First Aid is administered if needed or appropriate advice is given to seek the correct help. E.g. A 'Safe Haven Van' is available on Friday and Saturday evenings and is operated by Northumbria Police. It offers a warm environment and the opportunity to charge mobiles. Staff from St John's Ambulance / FSNE, situated next to the safe Haven are there too. Street Pastors remove thousands of bottles and glasses as they move around the City.

Patrols allow Street Pastors to meet people throughout the City. They take time to listen to and talk to revellers, the homeless, door and taxi rank staff; bar and restaurant staff, police and emergency services. The opportunity may well arise to discuss and promote Christian values and the power of prayer.

General Fund

Total income for 2022 amounted to £47,009 (£13028 in 2021) an increase of £33,981 (360%). The reason for the increase Northumbria Police were able to give £28,438 (2021 & 2022) from the night time levy, plus a number of PCC projects (£6999).

Total expenditure for 2022 amounted to £35,582 (£20,161 for 2021) an increase of £15,421 (76%). The main areas of expenditure are the Coordinator's salary, the service charge, licence fee & Uniforms. These are unavoidable costs and account for 79% of the running costs of the charity in 2022.

A surplus of £11,427 was reported in 2022, compared with a deficit of £3,133 in 2021.

Unrestricted reserves at 31 December 2022 are £26,921 which are held in cash with The Salvation Army's Bank, Reliance Bank. They amount to 9 months of expenditure.

The Trustees have set a minimum 6-month financial reserve target, which based on current expenditure levels is £2,965 per month. If this were reached, then the Trustees would seek to implement a strategy to secure the charity's financial viability. Based on pessimistic assumptions this situation will be reached in mid-2023

Restricted Fund

This relates to a project undertaken by PCC – Safety of Women at Night (SWAN), administered by Northumbria PCC and the Elsie Davis trust.. £11,998 was received, to be utilised in 2022.
