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Trustees' Report

The trustees, who are directors for the purposes of company law, present the annual report together with the financial statements of the charitable company for the year ended 31 December 2022.

Objectives and activities

Public benefit

The trustees confirm that they have complied with the requirements of section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

Activities undertaken to further public benefit

FIND exists to relieve poverty in the area of the Borough of Ipswich and a 35 mile radius thereof of persons who by reason of their individual family or economic circumstances or by reason of illness, disability or handicap are in need, hardship or distress, by the provision of services, money and facilities and household items (including food, fuel, clothing, tools, furniture, bedding, safety equipment, heating, cooking or washing appliances and such other items as may be needed).

FIND is blessed with the generosity of so many individuals, businesses, clubs, churches and schools (to list but a few) enabling us to provide a variety of much needed aid i.e.: beds and bedding, clothing, furniture, white goods, school uniforms, gas and electric, travel costs, temporary accommodation, the list goes on.

We must never give up on doing all we can to provide for those in need, we are at times their only hope, passing by on the other side must NOT be an option. Never think that the little you can do is not worth doing, because it won't make a difference, believe me IT DOES!!

To each and every FIND volunteer (of which there are many), to my supportive Trustees, to the Donors, Fundraisers, Providers and those who encourage. `Thank you` for blessing me.

Chair's Report 2022

Not wanting to trumpet blow but FIND <u>IS</u> a vital resource of aid and support to the thousands (yes thousands) of individuals in need in Suffolk. For rarely does a day go by when a referrer from one of the many agencies accessing FIND does not express that without FIND they would not know who to turn to.

FIND has become more than a food bank or a supplier of household items – advice is sought (quite often by the referrers), for an array of issues.

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Trustees' Report

We are the box of tissues, mopping up the tears of the desperate, continuing to feed, clothe, furnish and pay for accommodation. We listen and care, giving hope where far too often there seems no way forward — no lighting of their dark days.

The intense 2 years of Covid led me to hope that 2022 would bring a breathing space, a time to recuperate but it was not to be. The financial strain of Covid on Central and Local Government dealt another blow and economical disaster. Rising costs on food, fuel, household basics and the war in Ukraine meant that the resources of FIND were also to be tested.

Yet again the amazing supporters and donors stepped up to the plate – monetary giving continued (and still continues), ensuring that what FIND needed and was obtainable was affordable.

Thirty-two years ago I said that if the charity does good then it would be blessed with all it needs - I have continued to say this, for FIND (and myself), have been truly blessed.

2022 was a high speed train, leaving the station in January and not stopping until December. The months sped by vanishing into the past but during that time, in excess of 10,000 food parcels were given out. 35 children received new beds, dozens of homeless were found respite from the streets, washing machines, cookers and other white goods relieved the pressure for dozens of households, 6,000 individuals received help from FIND.

Six days a week volunteers played a part, packing, delivering, sorting, collecting customer donations from Sainsbury's, East of Ipswich Co-op, Waitrose, Lidl – all so vital. Picking up the weekly order from George, a local butcher and Aldi amounted to an outlay of around £30k, paid for through the giving of donors.

32 years on and FIND was needed and used. I give my thanks to each and every volunteer, to the hundreds who gave because they cared. To the Trustees and to each and everyone who comforted me with words of kindness and encouragement during my time of bereavement and I thank God for the strength and obstinacy I needed!

2 Accounting policies

Summary of significant accounting policies and key accounting estimates

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102). They also comply with the Companies Act 2006 and Charities Act 2011.

Basis of preparation

Find (Families in Need) Ltd meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes.

Going concern

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern nor any significant areas of uncertainty that affect the carrying value of assets held by the charity.

Exemption from preparing a cash flow statement

The charity opted to early adopt Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016 and have therefore not included a cash flow statement in these financial statements.

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Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2022

Income and endowments

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of the income receivable can be measured reliably.

Donations and legacies

Donations are recognised when the charity has been notified in writing of both the amount and settlement date. In the event that a donation is subject to conditions that require a level of performance by the charity before the charity is entitled to the funds, the income is deferred and not recognised until either those conditions are fully met, or the fulfilment of those conditions is wholly within the control of the charity and it is probable that these conditions will be fulfilled in the reporting period.

Expenditure

All expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to that expenditure, it is probable settlement is required and the amount can be measured reliably. All costs are allocated to the applicable expenditure heading that aggregate similar costs to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of resources, with central staff costs allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges allocated on the portion of the asset's use. Other support costs are allocated based on the spread of staff costs.

Raising funds

These are costs incurred in attracting voluntary income, the management of investments and those incurred in trading activities that raise funds.

Charitable activities

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.

Governance costs

These include the costs attributable to the charity's compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements, including audit, strategic management and trustees' meetings and reimbursed expenses.

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Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2022

Taxation

The charity is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 of the Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes. Accordingly, the charity is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income or capital gains received within categories covered by Chapter 3 Part 11 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or Section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992, to the extent that such income or gains are applied exclusively to charitable purposes.

Tangible fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £500.00 or more are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Fund structure

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds set aside for specific purposes at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted income funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.
