Achievements against objectives set	Para 1.41	Being a newly formed charity, just over a year on from registration, our objectives during 2021-22 have been to put down firm foundations upon which the charity can grow in future years, both for the benefit of our Members and for the public benefit. The trustees believe that these objectives have largely been met and are determined to continue building and improving the charity and its governance mechanisms during 2023.
Performance of fundraising activities against objectives set	Para 1.41	As the charity was formed during the latter stages of the effects of Covid-19 on the UK economy and the beginnings of recovery, expectations for fundraising were relatively low during the reporting period. We have been awarded just one restricted grant to assist in building our badminton offer and the few fundraising events we managed to operate have been disappointing, yet encouraging at the same time, with low yields but growing interest in our aims for the growth of the charity and its work with Plymouth's intellectual disability community.

Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	In our first 14 months of existence we have achieved much in creating our charity and its branding and getting word to interested parties about our aims and objectives. This has been achieved by much hard work from our volunteers in fundraising to pay the costs of the start-up, and has laid a good foundation for further growth without going into debt. There is more to do, but the coming year is looking better as the country begins to return to "normal" with the Covid-19 restrictions having been lifted. The charity has sufficient restricted funds to finance our intended annual disability games for several years and a small cash balance to cope with minor expenditure while we build attendance and membership to sustain our income to finance daily operations.
Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held	Para 1.22	The trustees are firmly committed to achieving financial stability and sustainability. The charity's operations vary from month to month and income streams are not regular. Attendance at our activity evenings varies, and thus our weekly

Amount of reserves held	Para 1.22	subscriptions income, and has not stabilised yet post Covid-19. The trustees feel it is unacceptable for the charity to go into debt, incurring extra, unnecessary costs and losing the good relationships we have with our suppliers, both of goods and services, thus a modest balance should be held in unrestricted funds to cope with variations in our outgoings and income streams. Work is in hand to analyse this as part of the current budgetary control regime and is monitored monthly. As at 31 December 2022 the charity held an unrestricted funds balance of £4,129.04 which, based on past expenditure, should sustain operations for approximately nine to ten months with little or no income, and few, if any startup costs in the coming year. Once financial and risk analysis has been completed for 2023, the trustees plan on increasing the target amount of reserves that should be held to sustain at least one year of budgeted operating costs. This will give the charity a buffer against any likely increased costs due to the current rate of inflation, reduced income due to reduced disposable income among potential donors and unexpected expenses that may arise in the coming year.

Despite not yet being registered with the Fundraising Regulator or any other voluntary scheme for regulating charity fundraising, the Trustees have endeavoured to ensure that all fundraising activities meet the requirements of the Fundraising Code of Practice for the protection of the charity, its donors and potential donors. Being a charity whose Members are all considered to be vulnerable, the Trustees are well aware of the effect that fundraising behaviour detailed in S.13 (4) (2) of the Charities (Protection and Social Investment) Act 2016 can have on people, especially the vulnerable. The Trustees therefore insist on courtesy, respect and passive behaviour in charity fundraising, where money is never asked for other than from grant-giving organisations or when selling goods. The Trustees have received no complaints about the fundraising activities of the charity during the reporting period.
