This building of a two-way relationship is established at the outset, and is another criterion which is used to differentiate between families. Such a model will also be applied as the charity looks to expand internationally to other countries.</p>

Para 1.20	<p>2021 was the year in which Uthavum Karam became established as a charity, with the focus on building a core base of volunteers for fundraising efforts. Funds were raised through the remote tutoring services, which operated throughout the Covid-19 pandemic, offering young, disadvantaged students with supplementary education.</p> <p>Overseas, the organisation identified families in Sri Lanka who had been affected by Civil War and required continual support to fund further education or job opportunities. Towards the second half of 2021, funds were being regularly transferred to these families on a monthly.</p>
