Both morning and evening services have stayed constant with occasional extra high numbers when everyone attends. We have worked our way through books of the Bible, together with a monthly topical series on "What the Bible teaches about" Prayer meeting attendance has grown slightly, often 18 people attend. During the year we have had missionary visits as part of the meetings - UCCZ (Zimbabwe), Mercy Air, SASRA, Middle East Reformed Fellowship (MERF) and the Romanian Mission. We also have special prayer meetings after our evening services, as needs arise. S-Club numbers are variable week-to-week. Two leaders took a break from teaching, and one leader has moved away from the area. One of the helpers has taken on a teaching role to maintain the activity. All Sorts (toddler group) numbers have been consistent, and around the capacity we can cope with. The team does an excellent job building relationships and helping the parents. Right Steps seated fitness group is for the less mobile. The group members are very regular and stay for drinks and cake afterwards, with opportunity to talk. There is a short "thought for the day" to bring a spiritual message alongside the exercise. We started a new Kids Club for children in reception, year 1 and 2. The numbers were slow to start with, but there is an encouraging growth in numbers as kids join from the All Sorts toddler group. One of the purposes of the group is to continue existing relationships with the All Sorts adults and children. The ladies have started a regular Bible-study and Book Club, with a good number attending. Our pastor continues to visit the local middle school, with a new opportunity at a local primary school starting soon. |

1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) and the Charities Act.

Verwood Road Evangelical Chapel C.U.A (Charitable Unincorporated Association - unregistered charity) was merged with Verwood Road Evangelical Chapel C.I.O. (Charitable Incorporated Organization) on 1 July 2021. Land and buildings which were held in a separate buildings trust were transferred to Verwood Road Evangelical Chapel C.I.O. on 22 March 2022.

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets on a straight line basis over their expected useful lives at the following annual rates:

Furniture, fixtures and equipment 33%

Freehold land and buildings

No depreciation is provided on freehold land and buildings as it is the trustees practice to maintin these assets in a continual state of sound repair.
