# Note to Last Year's Accounts.

#### Dorridge Methodist Church 2022/23.

The Church has continued its recovery post Covid and activity has increased. Services are well attended and organisations using the rooms at Church have continued to increase and we believe further organisations who have not met since Covid will return next year.

Inevitably some organisations have taken the decision to close where attendance has dropped and others have changed the way they operate all due to age or health or simply where there is no one to take them forward.

Work on the property identified in the last Quinquennial Report has continued and was completed with the redecoration of the Church itself. Looking forward the emphasis will now be one of maintenance with only small projects being proposed. Benches have been purchased and placed at the front of the Church and it is good to see them being used by members of the local community.

The Church has received the Eco Bronze Award and work is continuing in this important area to further improve which means our Carbon Footprint is reducing towards zero. Reference to such as climate change is mentioned in services and there are regular features in the fortnightly DMC Connects publication.

We have continued to use computer technology for some meetings and Zoom is still used. Although we have lost the services of our Lay Pastoral Worker these meetings and others such as Tea Parties and Third Friday Lunch have filled the space. Overall DMC is a caring Church and members get together to help and support where necessary. It is hoped that in the future a Lay Worker will be found and work is continuing in this respect.

During the year the Church has been registered for Same Sex Marriages and the local community is further well supported with Funerals and Baptisms

There has been a picnic and other events during the year. The Church vestibule has been decorated when appropriate. Many thanks are due to members, spouses and friends who organise and help with these and all the other activities that go on in the life of the Church.

We thank God that attendance is being maintained, that financially we are on a sound footing going forward and the property is in good overall condition. With Gods help and guidance we hope that this will continue and that the membership can be expanded during the coming years.
