The protection and preservation of the environment for the public benefit of food waste minimisation in particular by: 1) the provision of redistribution of food to the public 2) raising awareness of food waste

Still Good Food work for the public benefit by working to reduce food waste in West Suffolk and more generally across East Anglia so as to protect and preserve the environment for the public good.

This is achieved principally through the following activities:

- Collections and receipt of food into our shops and store from supermarkets, other outlets and distributors help reduce the quantity of perfectly edible food that goes to landfill or incineration.
- Similarly we work with the local farming community to glean vegetable crops that are excess to requirements or slightly below retailers standards and would otherwise be wasted or ploughed in.
- The food is re-distributed to the general public through our shops for which we ask a small donation to help with running costs
- Through our shops and at public events we inform the public about the problem of food waste, environmental and economic, and raise the profile of the charity's work in addressing the issue.

As Trustees of Still Good Food we have carried out the purposes of the Charity for public benefit by making decisions that have had due regard for public benefit guidance issued by the Charity Commission, when exercising any powers or duties to which the guidance is relevant.

As trustees of Still Good Food we acknowledge the service to the community and dedicated commitment of all volunteer team members who do a fantastic job in supporting the work of the charity. Our volunteers help with stock movements, service and run our shops, represent us at promotional public events and generally support our part-time staff.

We are very grateful for all the volunteers who selflessly give up their time to help and without whom Still Good Food would not operate.

Section D

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Still Good Food has continued to go from strength to strength over the last year. We have seen a significant increase in customer numbers reaching a peak of 900 a month in March 23 across both our shops. We increased our opening hours at our Great Barton shop in May 22 by opening on an additional day and this rural location continues to be very well used.

Our Community Fridge, hosted by Freedom Café, has proved to be very popular and well used. We have found accessing chilled foods quite difficult as suppliers are reluctant to donate chilled items and we are restricted by Use By dates.

Having secured the lease on an additional unit next to our existing unit in Elsey's Yard, in December 2022 we moved our shop next door to the newly refurbished unit and turned our existing unit into storage space. We were able to include a fridge and freezer in our new shop which proved to be very popular but continue to face the challenge of limited supplies of chilled or frozen foods.

We have continued to recruit volunteers and now have approximately 45 regular volunteers to supervise the shops and collect and transport stock donations.

We employed a part time Stock Coordinator in April 2022 which has greatly helped with our stock management and distribution between our two shops. We have continued to see an increase in donated stock and have welcomed new suppliers who donate their surplus food to us on a regular basis.

Our Farm Produce Rescue/Gleaning project continued to grow and we were able to collect and redistribute over 7 tonnes of farm produce including apples, pears, onions and cabbages that would otherwise have been unharvested or ploughed back into the fields. This produce was distributed through our shops to our customers and also to other local charities.

In November 2022 we received the Suffolk Greenest County Award in the Waste Reduction and Recycling category for the second year running.

We have been involved in a number of events to highlight the problem of food waste and to encourage people to get involved in reducing food waste including:

Achievements and performance

- Bury St Edmunds Spring Fayre and the Bury Food and Drink Festival where we were invited to speak on the 'Food Theatre Kitchen'.
- Running our 'Eat Your Pumpkin Festival' in Oct 22 in partnership with Great Barton Primary Academy and Freedom Café, having received funding from Hubbub.
- Speaking at various community group meetings including the WI and Second Chance Stroke Club.
- Partnering with West Suffolk College and Abbeygate Sixth Form and taking part in the West Suffolk College World of Work: Earth, Ecology & Environmental Careers Event and their Sustainability Market.

We have a number of plans in progress, some still in the planning phase, some implemented and coming to fruition:

- Opening our Freedom Church shop for more additional sessions.
- The employment of a part time Shop Manager to provide consistent management across both shops.
- The introduction of contactless payments (currently we can only accept cash).
- Working to increase our impact on Farm Rescue (Gleaning).

We continue to recruit new volunteers and actively seek new sources of surplus food.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

Still Good Food has a policy to hold unrestricted reserves sufficient to finance estimated operating costs for around 3 to 4 months. It is acknowledged, the operating model is such that significantly the charity's activities will continue to be financed by grants and similar restricted funding.

On 31st March 2023, Still Good Food had just under 7 months unrestricted reserves, hence well above the policy range. Staff costs and overheads are expected to increase markedly in the ensuing year and the trustees consider it prudent to temporarily hold reserves in excess of its usual operating policy.

All funds remain in surplus.
