We actively seek new trustees to join the management team by writing to the hall's main user groups prior to each AGM asking if they wish to nominate a chosen representative as well as approaching members of the parish both personally and via the local parish magazine.

Purpose of the Charity

As set out in the charity's governing document the purpose of the charity is to run the parish hall and recreation field in Beaumont in such a way as to promote for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish of Beaumont.

Activities During the Year

During the year monthly coffee mornings family Bingo nights were run as well as specific events including a Jubilee Fun Day, August afternoon teas, Community Pop Up Café, Children's Halloween Party, a Beetle Drive, an Autumn Craft Fair, Christmas wreath making as well as a Play and various talks, the annual Bonfire Night, over 60's lunch and Children's Christmas Party.

The hall was well supported by its community user groups the WI, the flower club, the parish council, local youth club, summer playscheme a weekly yoga class and short mat bowling afternoons as well as general hall hire.

Financial Activities

During the year the hall was awarded £20,000 from Cumbria Waste Management (£18,000 net of the stipulated 10% contribution), £4000 from the 0-19 fund, £1000 from Carlisle County Council and £4200 from Carlisle City Council to help purchase outdoor play equipment. The total cost of the new Play equipment was £36,164.02.

The hall received £1380 of maintenance grants from Beaumont Parish Council for the grass cutting and maintenance of the hall and play equipment and £1353 from Carlisle Council in Jubilee Grants.

General hall activities brought in an income of £4966.67 and general expenditure was £8756.82 (including new heaters of £2492.26). This produced a general running deficit of £3790.15.

Fundraising for the New Hall continued with £15,948.84 being raised by way of fundraising events, donations and grants. Expenditure in relation to the New Hall fund amounted to £18,215.62 which all related to professional fees that funding had been received for in the previous year.

Taking account of all of the above the hall incurred expenditure in excess of income of $\pounds 15,021.39$ during the year however this was mainly the result of timing differences.

The Charity remains in a strong financial position overall with reserves of £85688.75.

Treasurers Annual Report

2022/23 has been a busy year for the hall.

The hall is now used on a regular basis for monthly coffee mornings, Parish Council meetings, The WI, Flower Club, Yoga and Short Matt Bowling.

In April the hall held the first of its two over 60's lunch both of which were well supported with the total cost to the hall of the two being £15.21. It also saw the return of the ever popular Beetle Drive which raised £92.00. During April the New Hall Fund also received a kind donation of £350.00 from Mrs Lynne Graham in memory of her late Mother.

May saw the receipt of £4000 from the 0-19 fund and £1000 from Carlisle County Council towards the new play equipment.

In June the Parish come together for the late Queens Platinum Jubilee Celebrations which along with the help from council grants raised £1429.15 for the New Hall. £9000 was paid to AL Daines for professional services which along with other expenditure later in the year was covered by the lottery grant received last year.

July and August saw a community pop up café which raised £556.79 as well as the August Afternoon Teas which raised ££895.84 both for the new hall. The hall was also used by the summer playscheme and Mrs B Kirk and Mrs A Stasaitis kindly held a joint birthday party to raise an additional £650.30. Mrs Alice Graham, a great supporter of the hall grew and sold fresh produce and kindly donated all proceeds. Architects + were paid £5729.38 to take the new hall plans to building regs approval. The hall also hosted the Annual Playscheme.

In September it was party time again, but this time for Mrs K Bowron who held her belated 75th birthday party which raised £1706 on the night to add to donations in lieu of gifts she received last year. After a long wait Donley's supplied an interim bill of £2346.24 re the plans for the new hall and Bob Lancaster was paid for new hall heaters at a cost of £2492.26.

In October Mrs Judith Swinsco greatly surprised the hall by making an extremely generous donation of £4000 to the hall rebuilding fund. Mrs Swinsco has over the years been extremely generous and I would like us to take this opportunity to thank her. October also saw two first's for many years in the form of a children's Halloween party which was very popular and made £67.16 and a play entitled "The Frozen Roman" which raised £380.62.

November saw the return of the Fireworks and Bonfire Night as well as the Autumn craft fair which raised £365.23 and £336.44 respectively. The Parish was asked to attend a free Cheese and Wine evening to come up with fundraising ideas and resulted in £80 being raised on the night. Annual Maintenance grants of £1380 were received from Beaumont Parish Council in relation to hall maintenance, grass cutting and play area maintenance.

December got off to a festive start with a wreath making day raising £305 quickly followed by the children's Christmas Party which was slightly subsidised by £76.63.

January saw the introduction of monthly Family Bingo Nights which in the first three months have raised £283.01. January also saw Richard and Di giving a talk on Cycling Round China which raised £274 and hopefully is just Part 1 in the series.

February was the second of the over 60's lunch and Harold ventured over to Haltwhistle to give very informative guided tour of Haltwhistle Station raising £380 in doing so.

The year was rounded off by Mr J Huggon giving a talk on the history of Beaumont which was well supported and raising £505 for the new hall and Cumbria Waste Management awarded the Hall a grant of £20,000 towards the new play equipment which was installed by Wicksteed at a cost of £36,164.02. As part of the grant agreement 10% or £2000 of donations received from other sources had to be paid to Cumbria Waste Management.

Taking all of the above into account The Hall's total Income for the year was £50,115.07 and expenditure £65,136.46 resulting in expenditure in the year exceeding income by £15,021.39. £3790.15 related to the day to day running of the hall and £11,231.24 to restricted funds (New Hall rebuilding and the new Play Equipment).

Reserves at the year end were £85,688.75 being split as general reserves of £58,977.63 and restricted of £26, 711.12 so while every action needs to be taken to ensure that income exceeds expenditure in relation to the day to day expenditure of the hall 1 am confident that the hall is in a secure financial position for the future.
