### **Trustees' Report**

The trustees present the annual report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2023.

#### **Objectives and activities**

#### **Objects** and aims

The charity's objective is to promote, foster and encourage the study of map history in all its branches.

#### Objectives, strategies and activities

In order to achieve its objectives the charity produces a twice yearly journal of the history of cartography.

#### Public benefit

The trustees confirm that they have complied with the requirements of section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

#### **Chairman's Statement**

The Annual Meeting was held via zoom on 12 December 2023.

The Board unanimously passed a Special Resolution to change the Imago Mundi CIO Constitution Objectives from the objectives of the 1961 'Articles of Association' to the following:

to promote and extend interest in the history of cartography, maps and mapping worldwide

to oversee publication of the journal 'Imago Mundi: The International Journal for the History of Cartography'

to co-ordinate the biennial series of International Conferences on the History of Cartography.

Jordana Dym presented the Editors' Report to the Board. She updated Trustees on the transition between the previous and current Editors, and on recent changes to the Journal's personnel. She commented on innovations in volume 75.1, and outlined plans and a schedule of publication for coming issues.

The Board discussed the forthcoming International Conferences on the History of Cartography (ICHC) in Lyon (2024) and (Prague 2026) as well as fundraising by the American Friends of Imago Mundi. The AFIM can now receive donations, and currently has around \$7000 in the bank. Its priorities include supporting younger scholars in the history of cartography, and the mooted Imago Mundi CIO website.

The Board discussed the Review of Imago Mundi Ltd (now Imago Mundi CIO). Trustees welcomed the proposal to take responsibility for the management of the maphistory.info site. The Board agreed that a sub-committee comprising Daniel Crouch, Jim Akerman, Chris Fleet, one of the IM Editors, and Carolina Martinez (to be invited as an external member), should be formed to advise on a plan to adopt and manage the maphistory.info site.

The Board considered the proposed timetable for the replacement of Trustees within the next five years. The Board agreed to the proposal of the Review committee that Imago Mundi CIO should authorise a statement on Equality, Diversity, and Inclusion on its webpage.

The Hon. Treasurer presented the accounts for the financial year ending 31 March 2022, and a financial statement for the year ending 31 March 2023 and to date.

On the advice of the Hon. Treasurer, the Board agreed to recommend the reappointment of Beresfords as Imago Mundi CIO's accountants.

# **Trustees' Report (continued)**

#### Going concern

There is a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason it continues to adopt the going concern basis in preparing financial statements.

The Trustees are aware of the necessity to seek clarification on British Library policy concerning the status of archives such as the Imago Mundi one, which is housed at the British Library. Clarification will help to create a set of principles for the archive in the future.

#### Structure, governance and management

#### Nature of governing document

The charity was converted to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation on 4th October 2023 and the governing document is the CIO - Foundation dated 4th October 2023.

#### **Recruitment and appointment of trustees**

The management of the Charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the CIO Foundation.

#### Induction and training of trustees

Trustees are recruited in line with the needs of the Charity and given relevant training.

#### Arrangements for setting key management personnel remuneration

The Trustees consider the Board of Trustees as comprising the key management personnel of the Charity in charge of directing and controlling the Charity and running and operating the Charity on a day to day basis.

All Trustees give their time freely and no trustee remuneration was paid in the year.

### Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2023

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the second edition of the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice issued in October 2019, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

#### **Basis of preparation**

Imago Mundi meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. The accounts (financial statements) have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts.

#### **Going concern**

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

#### Income and endowments

#### Investment income

Dividends are recognised once the dividend has been declared and notification has been received of the dividend due.

#### Expenditure

All expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to that expenditure, it is probable settlement is required and the amount can be measured reliably. All costs are allocated to the applicable expenditure heading that aggregate similar costs to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of resources, with central staff costs allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges allocated on the portion of the asset's use. Other support costs are allocated based on the spread of staff costs.

#### Charitable activities

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

#### **Governance costs**

These include the costs attributable to the charity's compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements, including audit, strategic management and trustees meetings and reimbursed expenses.

#### Taxation

The charity is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 of the Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes. Accordingly, the charity is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income or capital gains received within categories covered by Chapter 3 Part 11 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or Section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992, to the extent that such income or gains are applied exclusively to charitable purposes.

### Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2023 (continued)

#### Tangible fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £100.00 or more are initially recorded at cost, less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

#### **Depreciation and amortisation**

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:

**Depreciation method and rate** 25% on reducing balance

#### **Trade debtors**

Trade debtors are amounts due from customers for merchandise sold or services performed in the ordinary course of business.

Trade debtors are recognised initially at the transaction price. They are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. A provision for the impairment of trade debtors is established when there is objective evidence that the charity will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

#### **Trade creditors**

are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Accounts payable are classified as current liabilities if the does not have an unconditional right, at the end of the reporting period, to defer settlement of the creditor for at least twelve months after the reporting date. If there is an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the reporting date, they are presented as non-current liabilities.

#### **Fund structure**
