		Barnstaple Concert Band was invited to play at the Grosvenor Church Carol Concert which is always very well attended. It was a lovely festive occasion and the carols and Christmas music was wonderful and loved by all those that were at the concert.
		In September, in order to enhance the full and rounded sound of the band we purchased a Bass Clarinet. This has made an incredible difference to the balance of the band and is helping out the bass section which has been lacking in numbers recently. We have been fortunate to have new clarinet members join

the senior band to enable a player to go over to play the Bass Clarinet.

The band has also invested in new music this year, to further enhance our repertoire of music we play. This is both good for the audience to hear a wide-ranging variety of music at concerts and also challenging and more interesting for our players

The Training band is for all abilities of playing and includes both children and adults. Various styles of music are played and enjoyed together to improve their musical standards and have the experience of playing in a band.

In March 2023, after contact with the North Devon Hospice and The Barnstaple Ladies Choir, we held a joint concert in Newport Church, Barnstaple. The concert was well advertised and the church was full for the evening.
