REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2023

Structure, Governance and Management

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity. It has five trustees who are re-appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting. New trustees are appointed by existing trustees using the provisions of the governing document.

Objectives and Activities

The objectives of the charity are as follows:

- Promotion of health and relief of sick, ill and disabled people particularly but not exclusively by the use of natural healing methods and the provision of herbal medicines;
- Education of public on all health matters and in particular in the growing and harvesting and storage of wholesome foodstuffs in nutrition in food preparation; and
- Conservation of the environment in general and in particular the taking of remedial action where neglect pollution or any other cause is having an adverse effect on the health of the local population.

The activity of the charity is as follows:

· Operation of free advisory clinics.

The trustees have reviewed their objectives, policies and activities to ensure they continue to reflect the charity's aims. In carrying out this review they have considered the Charity's Commission's revised general guidance on public benefit.

Achievements and performance

The charity has achieved a great deal over the years by:

- Caring for those afflicted and affected by Lyme Disease in all stages;
- Creating Lyme Disease Awareness Campaigns;
- Opening a Helpline for those with Lyme Disease offering Integrated Medicine advice;
- Creating facilities in clinic for those with Neurological Conditions;
- Facilities now available for on line FREE consultations;
- Setting up organic herb growing facilities;
- Setting up endangered wild plant species facilities;
- Mental Health support and counselling; and
- Working with those in the community who need support.

The charity relies on the volunteers to meet the objectives of the charity.

Financial review

During the year, the charity had net receipts of £192 in the year (2022: net payments £1,161). Total receipts decreased by £375 to £26,792. The total cash funds held at the year end were £227 (2022: £35). These are unrestricted funds. The charity's policy on reserves is that where operationally possible, to hold sufficient funds either in liquid investments, cash or realisable assets to meet the immediate contractual obligations of the charity.

Risk and investments

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which this charity is exposed relating to its operations and finances and are satisfied that under the present system there is no significant exposure.

Investment policy need not be considered as the charity has no significant investments.

The trustees declare that they have approved the trustees' report above.
