I report on the accounts of Parochial Church Council Of King Charles The Martyr Falmouth for the year ended 31 December 202

Respective responsibilities of trustees and independent examiner As the charity's trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts, you consider that the audit requirement of section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Charities Act) and that an independent examination is needed. RESERVES POLICY

It is the policy of the PCC at King Charles the Martyr to maintain a balance of unrestricted funds (if possible), which equates to approximately six months unrestricted payments, to cover emergency situations that may arise from time to time.

Financial reserves are necessary to ensure that short term fluctuations in income do not affect the PCC's ability to meet its financial obligations. However, with the continued demands of MMF payments and running expenses we may need to dip into the reserves more often.

Our funds are invested with the CBF Church of England Investment Fund - Income Shares restricted for Fabric, National Savings - Income Bonds restricted for the Choir and shares in Standard Life (formally Dunedin). We also receive an income from the Fred Piper Will Trust.
