Para 1.20	<b>The church body has continued to grow from the previous year with approximately 120 children and adults now attending Sunday meetings in the local community hall. The church continues to provide support to many individuals in the local community, some of whom, are now part of the church family. Regular fun days for children and entertainment evenings are well-attended. Weekly drop-in sessions and the provision of food and household items are now well established, and frequently visited. A warm space was particularly welcomed by the community during the colder weather. Connections and relationships are now also well established with other faith groups and community hubs in the locale. The church continues to provide volunteers and finance in all of the areas mentioned.</b>

This gave a net surplus of £21,738 for the year.</p> <p>Gift Aid was claimed in this financial period and amounted to £9,022 (included in income above).</p> <p>Income is above the £25,000 threshold so accounts have been independently examined by TCA Accountants and Business Advisors, 21 St.Mary's Street, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Shrewsbury, Shropshire SY1 1ED.</p>

This means that money is freely available to spend on any of the charity's purposes. 


