The Trustees submit their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2023.

History, objectives and activities of the Charity

The principal activity of the Charity is the provision of Almshouses for widows, spinsters and married couples over the age of 50. The Charity is a Registered Charity (number 204808).

It is believed that the Charity was formed in the 12th Century. It is now regulated by a Scheme dated 26th February 1964, as amended by a Scheme dated 6th October 1969, approved and established by the Charity Commissioners of England and Wales under the Charities Act 1960. The Charity deregistered as a Registered Social Landlord with effect from 24th November 1998.

Management and governance arrangements

The body of Trustees shall consist when complete of 9 competent persons being 6 nominative Trustees and 3 cooptative Trustees. Three nominative Trustees appointed by the Vicar and Churchwardens for the time being of the Ecclesiastical Parish of St. John Baptist, Cirencester (V & C) and three by Cirencester Town Council (CTC). Each such nominative appointment is made for a term of 4 years at a meeting convened and held according to the ordinary practice of the appointing body. The person appointed may be, but need not be, a member of the appointing body. The co• optative Trustees (co-opt) shall be persons residing or carrying on business in or near the area of the Ancient Parish of Cirencester. Each co-optative Trustee is appointed for a term of 5 years by a resolution of the Trustees passed at a meeting. Co-optative Trustees are selected with a view to the nature of their skills and experience so as to achieve a balance of relevant skills amongst the body of Trustees as a whole. The Chairman of Trustees' responsibilities, the governing document, administrative procedures, the history and philosophical approach of the Charity.

The Trustees annually review the risks that the Charity faces.

Achievements and performance of the Charity

The main activity of the Trust remains the maintenance of the almshouses and the support to residents. With 24 properties, one of which is let on commercial terms and some of which are very old, there have been appropriate renovations to ensure that they are both sound, but that increasing attention has been paid to sustainability. The work of the surveyor appointed by the Trust is particularly important in assessing and managing the need for renovations suitable for elderly people.

The Trust is also the owner of two large allotment sites (with a total of 150 plots). These continue to be fully occupied by local people and form a valuable green space for well-being through vegetable and other horticultural growing. The management of these is assisted by voluntary managers on each site. There is major tree work underway at one site to improve the amenity of the site; the other site will need attention in coming years.

Finally, the Trust is also the owner/custodian of a historic property, the Chantry of St John the Evangelist which was formerly part of the hospital of the Abbey of St Mary in Cirencester. There have been prolonged discussions with Historic England about the conservation of this property, which is about 700 years old. Whilst the surveyor keeps a watching brief on the property, there is need for major conservation work as some of the pillars supporting the building have been damaged over the years. A proposal to place iron railings around the columns was rejected by Historic England and temporary wooden railings are now in place pending a longer term solution.

The most significant change during the year came with the change of Clerkship, the first change since 1998. The new Clerk had an induction programme which began on 2nd January 2022 and gradually took over full responsibility for all aspects of the Charity's work so that by the end of March 2022, she was fully responsible for all the running of the Charity's activities although not all the documents had been transferred as agreed. This change of Clerk has also prompted a major review of policies and practice to ensure that the Charity is now up to date on all governance matters. It has also triggered changes to the Scheme and governance of the Charity which will move it over the coming years to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation as a firmer basis for managing the Trust in the 21st century. The Trustees have been pleased with the way the new Clerk has been able to inject energy into the organisation.

Financial review, investment policy and reserves

Net receipts for the year were £65,358 (2022 - net payments £64,381).

The Trustees' investment objective is to provide the best financial return in terms of income and capital growth for the Charity, having regard to the risks involved. Cash balances are held in bank accounts. Reserves not needed for immediate purposes and the Endowment Fund have been invested in M & G Multi- Asset Fund (formerly the National Association of Almshouses Common Investment Fund) and in a diversified portfolio with Brewin Dolphin, stockbrokers. During the year the Trustees carried out a detailed review of their cash reserves having regard to a comprehensive property maintenance schedule prepared in conjunction with the Charity's surveyor and determined to increase the amount invested by opening an account with C.C.L.A. After careful consideration the Trustees had also decided to transfer the funds invested in the portfolio with Brewin Dolphin to C.C.L.A., which arrangement was concluded during the year.

It is the policy of the Charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the Charity, at a level which provides sufficient funds to cover anticipated property expenses and managerial and administration costs. The adequacy of the reserves policy is reviewed annually.

The Trustees have considered carefully the impact of the COVID-19 crisis on the Charity and consider that it has sufficient reserves to withstand any anticipated financial implications.

Public benefit

They are also responsible for the safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
