#### Report Of The Management Committee For The Year Ended 31st July 2022

The Management Committee presents its Directors' Report and the unaudited financial statements for the year ended 31 July 2023.

#### **Governing Document**

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee. The company was incorporated on 6th July 2012 and registered as a charity on 20th August 2012. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 each.

#### **Objects**

The charity's objects are specifically restricted to the following:

- (1) the advancement of the arts, culture and education, and
- (2) the advancement in life of young musicians (as soloists or in ensembles) as they start their professional careers; in particular by providing sponsorship, financial assistance and performance opportunities in London or elsewhere,

provided that all of the Objects of the charity shall be wholly charitable in nature and shall be for the public benefit.

Nothing in the articles shall authorise an application of the property of the charity for purposes which are not charitable in accordance with Section 7 of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and/or section 2 of the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008.

#### **Achievements and Perfomance**

CMF's mission is 'turning talent into success'. We select exceptional classical soloists and chamber ensembles, as well as jazz, folk, and world musicians, at the start of their professional careers. At this time when managing 'the business of music' can be a challenge, CMF supports them with a comprehensive career development programme. We arrange artistic and business mentoring, run workshops, make CDs, videos and websites, commission new music, secure airtime on BBC Radio 3 and promotion through online, print and social media, and put on our own recitals, residencies and concerts. In addition we do agency and management, fixing performances at venues and festivals throughout the UK and beyond.

CMF Alumni tell us of the many ways CMF has helped them during the very fragile early stages of their professional careers, by helping them to develop their unique creative vision, and gaining recognition and a network within the music industry.

Our aim is that CMF artists are ready for four decades or more of contributing to society's culture and wellbeing - reaching hundreds of thousands of people through live performance, CDs, streaming, broadcasts, teaching and mentoring - giving back a thousand fold what CMF has given them.

The financial year August 2022 to July 2023 has all been after the end of the Covid-19 pandemic and yet the music industry is still struggling to return to normality after a long period of limited live performing activity.

We selected 10 artists (soloist and ensembles) who joined us in September 2022, our 10th intake of CMF artists, in this our 10th Anniversary year. We kept the number taken to 10, equal to the 2020 and 2021 artists, and still the highest numbers ever. The number of applicants is sustained, and the calibre is exceptional. For the third year running, owing to the very positive feedback from Artists and venues alike, we took three singers in the cohort of 2022 CMF Artists specifically offering them artistic mentoring, as singers are unique in dealing with an instrument that goes on changing long after they have completed education at the conservatoires.

After three years of taking higher numbers of artists, as a way of supporting the most emerging performers that we can within our resources during and after the pandemic, we opted not to audition during 2023. The next application process commences in January 2024.

Our monthly live concert series in Barts Great Hall continued with all audiences attending in person and without live streams. Videos for the artists promotional purposes were made both from the concerts, and on dedicated filming days without audiences.

Barts Heritage celebrated the 900th Anniversary of the founding of the Priory and the Hospital. As partners of Barts Heritage this meant CMF artists participated and performed in a number of special events, including a special visit from King Charles III. CMF also commissioned music - Nine songs for Nine Centuries by Derri Lewis using found texts, and a Fanfare for St Bartholomew by Ken Hesketh, both of which were performed at a fundraiser in June 2023.

We continued our successful partnership with St Martin in the Fields with 20 concerts in the year, employing 38 Artists to perform. These have been popular both with our artists and with audiences.

Our residency at the Wallace Collection was unfortunately not possible as, in common with many arts organisations, the Wallace Collection is still having to manage its activities on a reduced budget since the pandemic.

Mentoring, coaching and workshops were programmed and taking place as usual and now once more conducted in person. All artists received a series of 7 one-to-one sessions with a professional life and business coach, which all of them found incredibly helpful at this stage in their careers.

The third trip of CMF Artist to Mexico as part of the International Exchange scheme through Anglo Arts was planned for Autumn 2023. Our 2021 International Scholar from Mexico rounded off a successful visit with obtaining a place for further study at the RAM, and enormous accolade for him, and for the CMF experience and support he had.

All the other CMF Artist Programme elements have continued, including recording CDs, making videos, agency and third-party bookings, appearances on BBC Radio 3 InTune, commissioning of new music, photography and building of websites. Our Artist Manager left CMF in June 2023.

Whilst working patterns for our musicians had more or less normalised after the catastrophic effects of the response to the pandemic, there remains a shortfall of funding across the industry, and this is reflected in the ability to negotiate artists' fees sufficient to make a living. Audiences are still at only about 70% - 80% of pre-pandemic levels. CMF artists are still re-establishing their careers, and so for many we have extended the usual two-year period of being on the CMF Artist Programme, continuing to provide mentoring, agency and management, and day to day support for longer. This has financial and resource implications for CMF.

This, plus the three consecutive years of taking 10 CMF Artists (soloists or ensembles) has contributed to the decision to advance the next recruitment process into early 2024.

# Independent Examiner's report to the trustees of City Music Foundation

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (as applied to small entities by section 1A of the standard).

#### **Fund Accounting**

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Management Committee for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subject to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

#### **Incoming Resources**

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activites when the charity is entitled to, and virtually certain to receive, the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

#### Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

- \*Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income.
- \*Charitable donations to other organisations.
- \*Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries.
- \*Governance costs include those associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity.
