We have partnered with Café meow in Blackpool who raise awareness of the plight of the unwanted cat population, and we provide cats that they can rehome for us whist they are living in the café. We trap and neuter and release feral cats to reduce the stray cat population. We continue to support the farm where cats have been dumped, taking in any kittens born to rehabilitate before they become feral and too wild to rehome.
