#### TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

The trustees present their report with the accounts of Christchurch Drill Hall Charity Trust for the year ended 31 December 2022.

The accounts have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis and in accordance with the accounting policies on page 9 and the governing document of the Charity and comply with the Charities Act 2011.

Legal and administrative information is set out on page 1 which forms part of this report.

# STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Trust originates from an indenture dated 28 July 1908 concerned with the establishment of premises for a company of the 7th Battalion of the Hampshire Regiment (Territorial Army) on land off Portfield Road in Christchurch. This indenture is still the governing document of the Trust. In the event that the company is disbanded and the premises are not required for military use, the trustees are to hold the property for the benefit of the "Town and Neighbourhood of Christchurch" and the inhabitants of Christchurch.

The Trust is managed by the trustees who meet not less than twice a year, and more often if necessary.

#### APPOINTMENT OF TRUSTEES

There shall be four ex-officio trustees and two nominated trustees at all times. The ex-officio trustees are the Chairman of Dorset RFCA, the Deputy Chief Executive of Wessex RFCA, the Mayor of Christchurch and the Vicar of the parish of Christchurch. The two nominated trustees are to be nominated by the Chairman of Dorset RFCA.

## **OBJECTIVES FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT**

- To provide the property owned by the Charity for use as a Drill Hall, offices, recreation rooms and residential quarters for and in connection with the organisation, training, drilling, assemblage, government recreation, and other military or other objects of the Christchurch Company of the Royal Hampshire Regiment.
- Any purpose which may be of utility to or for the benefit of the town or neighbourhood of Christchurch or any part thereof and the inhabitants thereof (including the purposes of any military corps to be hereafter formed in Christchurch) as the trustees shall be in their absolute discretion think proper and shall by deed direct.

## ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

As stated above, the Trust holds a property which was originally the premises for a company of the 7th Battalion of the Hampshire Regiment (Territorial Army) on land off Portfield Road in Christchurch. The main building is let to the Christchurch Borough Council on a full repairing lease and the Council sub-lets it to various community groups. Additional premises at the rear of the main building are let to the Wessex Reserve Forces and Cadets Association for use by a local unit of the Army Cadet Force and to Dorset Reclaim, a local charity. The Trust had net current assets valued at £200,693 (2021: £200,452) as at 31 December 2022. Rental income and investment interest beyond that required to maintain the Trust and the premises is available for disbursement. Grants to a total of £18,506 (2021: £19,150) were made in the year ended 31 December 2022. Canvassing of local organisations is done regularly but does not always generate many requests for financial help.

# TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

## **RESERVES POLICY**

The Trust holds net current assets valued at £200,693 (2021: £200,452) as at 31 December 2022. These are regarded as the Trust's reserves. The trustees seek, at the least, to maintain the real value of these funds, that is so to arrange the investments that they increase in monetary terms at a rate equal to or greater than inflation over an economic cycle. The reserves are maintained in order to generate sufficient investment income to fund the charitable activities of the charity.

#### **PUBLIC BENEFIT**

The Charities Act 2011 explicitly includes "Public Benefit" in the definition of "Charitable Purpose". The trustees, in accordance with section 17(5) of the Charities Act 2011, had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

In addition to making the hall available for local groups to use, the Trust also provides financial aid to local groups and individuals whose intended activity may be expected to be of benefit to the wider Christchurch community.

#### **GRANT MAKING POLICY**

The governing document allows the trustees wide discretion to make grants to the benefit of the "town and neighbourhood of Christchurch... and the inhabitants thereof". Subject to the availability of funds, the trustees will consider firstly applications from organisations working for the benefit of groups of people in Christchurch, and secondly to individual applicants from Christchurch with preference to those whose intended activity may be expected to be of benefit to the wider Christchurch community in the longer term. The trustees will consider applications from organisations whose areas of activity are outside Christchurch or not confined to Christchurch if there is clear evidence that these activities are of benefit to people from Christchurch.

#### **RISK MANAGEMENT**

The trustees acknowledge their requirements with regard to risk management and have put in place policies and procedures to monitor and mitigate risks.
