Dereham College - Support the students Sports BTEC vocational experience requirements. Coaching session take place twice a week, with matches at weekends against academy teams across East Anglia. All coaching to be provided by high level qualified coaches, with a low player to coach ratio, in order that the individual's needs are catered for. The coaching provides innovative methods to build confidence and self belief, enhancing social, as well as football skills. Develop relationships with academies and development centres to provide a competitive learning environment. Take the individuals out of their local area to compete in tournaments in the UK and abroad to develop their personality and social skills. Invite high profile guest coaches and speakers to broaden the individual experiences. Educate the players in all aspects of a sporting lifestyle and encourage the individuals reaching 16 years of age to continue their development through the Charities links with Easton College and Dereham Town Football Club.
