Structure and Management

Redditch Cat Rescue (RCR) is managed by Trustees of whom there shall be a minimum of three and a maximum of six. There are currently two trustees that form the management team who hold regular meetings to discuss and review progress and policies in the rescue. New trustees are appointed by existing trustees from within its volunteers. Election to post is decided at the AGM. They are briefed on their legal obligations, the decision-making progress, and the recent financial performance of the charity. We are currently in the progress of appointing two new trustees.

Risk Management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks that may arise within the rescue and to ensure appropriate controls/measures are in place to provide assurance against any error/fraud.

Financial Review

This year has been another busy year in which we have cared for, rehabilitated and rehomed where possible. Neutering and relocating feral cats where we can. As ever but particularly in the current climate there has been an ever-increasing number of cats needing help with people struggling with costs of neutering and general vet's bills. It has been a better year for fundraising as events are on the whole back up and running. However, several outside events have had to be cancelled due to adverse weather conditions. As always are generous supporters have donated where and however, they can. They have given monetary and non-monetary donations such as food and litter. We have two collections bins in both Tesco and Morrisons. We also have amazon Smile and easy fundraising accounts which donate money each time someone purchases items through it. All the this is a massive help in the day to day running of the rescue.

We hold three main fundraisers throughout the year as well as taking part in other smaller events organised by other organisations such as Botany Bay craft fayre and apple day a local community event.

Financial accounts are available for RCR for the year 2022/2023.

A policy minimum reserve value is not necessary. Current policy is to maintain sufficient cash funds for known commitments.

Public Benefits

Rescuing cats and kittens that need help and finding them forever homes. Helping people Financially with neutering costs. Also providing people with cat food for example people who are feeding cats that are not their own i.e. feral colonies.

Taking part in the Trap neuter return (TNR) programme. If it is possible after neutering and providing any necessary vetinary treatment they are relocated to outdoor homes such as stables and small holdings. This helps to reduce the expansion of feral colonies.

Giving advice and guidance to anyone who may need help verbally or through our website and Facebook page.

Objectives and Activities

The main objective of RCR remains to rescue cats and kittens in the Worcestershire and Birmingham areas and rehome where possible. The charity aims to achieve sufficient fundraising to look after the cats whilst in their care and to take part in the TNR programme. To help achieve this we have increased our number of volunteers and foster carers. We have recently provided a new pen to one of our fosterers so that we can increase the number of cats we are able to take in.

Volunteers

The charity is extremely grateful for the efforts of it volunteers who are involved in fostering, home checking, cattery cleaning, socialising nervous cats and fundraising. Without this valuable contribution of time and enthusiasm we would not be able to achieve as much.
