#### Independent Examiner's Report to the Members of MK Cat Rescue

I report on the accounts of MK Cat Rescue for the year ended 30 April 2022

### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts.

The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under section 144) of the Charities Act 2011 (the Charities Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts (under section 145 of the Act);
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission (under section 145 (5)(b) of the Act); and

#### Basis of independent examiner's report
