Appointments are made at the Annual General Meeting held in November.

Deanway United Church operates in a small community where the backgrounds of all its members are well known. Only members who are considered suitable as trustees are asked to stand for election. As a result, it is considered sufficient that potential trustees are instructed on the requirements of becoming a trustee, and then read and sign the Charity Commission's "Trustee Eligibility Declaration" form.

There is a safeguarding policy in place that complies with the safeguarding policies of the Methodist Church. The church has appointed a safeguarding officer. All trustees and members deemed by the Methodist Church in need of DBS checks have received checks. The Methodist Church also provides regular courses on safeguarding. All trustees attend these courses and other members of the church are encouraged to attend.

Deanway United Church is affiliated to both the Methodist and United Reformed Churches.

The trustees have not identified any significant areas of risk. The church is covered by public liability insurance to the value of £5,000,000.

To apply the income but not the capital for such charitable purposes for the benefit of the United Reformed Church at Chalfont St. Giles as the trustees in their discretion shall think fit.

The charity exists to provide the local community with spiritual and pastoral guidance and a place of worship. Under normal circumstances, the church holds public worship on almost every Sunday throughout the year and on other special religious occasions. The church also performs baptism, wedding and funeral services for the community as and when needed.

The church also holds social and fundraising events as part of its outreach programme.

With regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit, the trustees consider this charity falls within the purpose of the advancement of religion, or more specifically, the provision of a place of worship and the leadership for religious devotional acts and through its social activities, missionary and outreach work, aims to raise awareness and understanding of religious beliefs and practices.

Deanway United Church exists to help people find and follow Jesus in an ever-changing world. Our purpose is to be a Christ centred welcoming church, reaching out into the community with a worthwhile faith, developing fully committed followers of Christ, demonstrating God's love in such a way that others cannot ignore it.

We are gathered to worship and empowered to serve, in and through the gifts and graces bestowed by God upon our Counsellors, officers, members and adherents. We aim to be the way in which the life-changing power of Christ is released in Chalfont St Giles and beyond as we meet the people where they are first, not where ideally, we would have them be.

The church is run by a dwindling number of dedicated volunteers. Without their tireless support with fund raising, and with the general running of the church, it could not function.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The main achievement of the year has been the continued worship and service of God. During the COVID19 pandemic, the social activities of the church stopped, and many of these have not yet restarted.

The only fund-raising/social event success was the Christmas Fair. Fund-raising events help to cover essential expenditure and maintenance of the church building.

The church and its members normally hold a number of special collections for charity. This year, only one such collection was made, raising £83.75 plus gift aid for Christian Aid.

A few years ago, the church received a very significant bequest on the death of one of its members. Consequently, the church has significant reserves.

However, in future years, mainly due to increased demands from the Methodist Circuit, the church's outgoings will exceed its income, causing funds to be drawn from these reserves.

Although the funds are available to run outreach events into the local community, due to the age and diminishing numbers of people in the congregation, the church does not have the human resources to run many of these events.

The church's normal source of funding is the money given during the church services, or given monthly by members of the congregation. Like many other churches, this church is suffering from a declining congregation, so this income source is reducing. The church has a Manse, and while there is no minister in residence this is let to tenants to generate rental income. There are also usually a number of fundraising events during the year, the primary one being the Christmas Fair.

Most of the funds raised are passed to the Methodist and United Reformed Church circuits for the supply of a minister and other preachers to provide the community with leadership in worship. The rest of the funds are used to maintain and administer the church in which this worship can take place. Funds raised specifically for charitable work are passed directly on to those charities.

The Methodist Central Finance Board handles the investment of the church's reserves.
