The Trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2015.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 7 to the accounts and comply with the charity's trust deed, the Charities Act 2011 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities published on 16 July 2014.

Reference and Administrative Details of the Charity, its Trustees and Advisers

The charity is governed by the terms of a Declaration of Trust dated 8th June 1978, is registered with the Charity Commission under the number 276150 and is operated by the Administrative Trustees.

The charity previously had accounts filed and was registered as The Queen's Lancashire Regiment Museum Trust.

Structure, Governance and Management

The charity is governed by a trust deed and is operated by the Administrative Trustees incorporated as a body. Its property is held by the Trustees on behalf of the charity and they are subject to covenants set out in the Declaration of Trust dated 8th June 1978.

The Trustees also act as the council of the charity as defined in the said deed.

The Trustees meet six-monthly.

Objectives and activities of the Charity for the public benefit

The objects of the charity are to educate the public and members of the Regiment in the history and military accomplishments of the Regiment and to promote military efficiency and encourage recruitment by public exhibition of the collection in a museum or museums or such other public places as the Trustees may from time to time decide, and to conserve, restore, repair, reconstruct and preserve objects in the collection.

Reserves policy

The trustees aim to maintain sufficient free reserves in unrestricted funds to respond to applications for grants and ensure that support and governance costs are covered.

The balance held as unrestricted funds at 31 December 2015 was £32,154, of which £31,317 are regarded as free reserves, after allowing for funds tied up in tangible fixed assets.

Achievements, Performance and Financial Review

When planning the actrivities for the year, the trustees have considered the Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Following re-display of our principal gallery in 2014, the past year has generally been one of consolidation, with additional material being added to interactive computers and to the website.

Otherwise, the main curatorial activity has been the move of our collection, of over three thousand medals to a temporary display area, where they are being cleaned and researched pending permanent re-display once funds are available.

The museum has continued to receive donations of objects and archive material, and has, unusually, purchased an iconic regimental medal group following an appeal to supporters.

Two regimental First World War histories were reprinted in the course of the year as part of an ongoing programme of making our heritage more widely available.

Footfall continued buoyant at over 18,000 for the year, following a number of publicity initiatives, and website 'hits' totalled 257,804.

The charity's main regular source of income in 2015 has continued to be a grant from the Regimental Charity of The Duke of Lancaster's Regiment but, as this will shortly cease, considerable effort has been put into replacing it with additional museum-generated income, with annual giving, sponsorship and bequests, the first fruits of which will appear in 2016. The Friends of the Museum have continued their generous financial support, and grants received from Lancashire County Council, the Army Museums Ogilby Trust, and, although not passed through the account, the Ministry of Defence.

Trustees' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

The charity trustees are responsible for preparing a trustees' annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the charity trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, of the charity for that period. In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the applicable Charities SORP;
- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the applicable Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations, and the provisions of the Trust deed. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1 Accounting Policies

Accounting Convention

The accounts (financial statements) have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities published on 16 July 2014, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE), and the Charities Act 2011 and applicable regulations.

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to those accounts.

Incoming Resources

Voluntary Income is accounted for on receipt, except where it's deemed that a constructive obligation is in place, in which case they are accounted for on an accruals basis. Incoming resources from Charitable Activities comprise income from shop sales, research charges, group visits, archive income and special projects and are accounted for on becoming receivable.

Investment Income comprises income from the charity's Bank Accounts and is accounted for on receipt. The method of allocating Incoming Resources is shown in the Notes to the Accounts.

Resources Expended

Expenditure is included on an accruals basis. Costs of Charitable Activities and Governance comprise the cost of shop sales and costs in connection with fulfilling the objects of the charity, and satisfying its regulatory requirements respectively. The method of allocating Resources Expended is shown in the Notes to the Accounts.

Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value on a first in first out basis.

Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Shop Fittings 10% on cost Computer Equipment 33% on cost

Heritage Assets

The charity holds and maintains the contents of the Regimental Collection of The Duke of Lancaster's Regiment and its predecessors and there is a strong presumption against disposals. This collection is considerable and is made up of historical artefacts and other regimental military memorabilia and regalia, which has been added to the collection over time. Much, but not all, of the regimental collection, is held on public display. The vast majority of the collection has been donated over a considerable period of time. There have been no additions to or disposals from the collection during the year. No value of these assets is included in the charity's balance sheet because reliable cost information is not available and, in the view of the Trustees, the significant costs of valuing such a unique collection outweigh the benefits to users of assessing the Trustees' stewardship of the assets, bearing in mind the charity's principal object.
