	In 2015 ESSW took 161 English Springer Spaniels into their care who had either been surrendered by their owners or held in council care having been found straying. This was a decrease/increase of 8 on the total number of dogs taken into ESSW care in the previous year. Of those dogs, 2 were euthanised, both prior to re homing as they were deemed too aggressive to re home.
	ESSW continued to award lifetime veterinary sponsorship to dogs who require it due to advanced age or specific medical requirements.
Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory	ESSW continued to pay £50 towards the cost of castration for all 'entire' dogs that have been rehomed by us – neutering is specified in the ESSW re-homing contract that every new owner signs. Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year	ESSW are proud of the number of dogs they have helped during 2015 – many of these dogs would almost certainly have been put to sleep if ESSW were not able to assist in the rehabilitation and rehoming.
	However, ESSW have also been able to manage situations effectively where it has been in the best interests of the dog to put to sleep for its own welfare reasons. The alternative for some of these dogs would be a life of exclusion due to behavioural traits or a life of pain due to medical issues and age. Thankfully these occasions continue to be rare.
	It is also very satisfying for ESSW to know that they have been able to give advice and assistance to dog owners which has enabled them to work through issue with their English Springer Spaniel and continue a successful and happy relationship with their dog.
