Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

It has been a good year for the Trust, with significant growth in both dividend income and the total level of outward donations.

The trustees have continued with their policy of supporting charities with which they have been associated over the years, enabling them to keep in touch with developments and achievements at donee charities, while providing those charities with a regular source of income. As a result, seldom are the trustees able to start new long-term relationships. They are, however, pleased to be able to make occasional one-off donations, generally for fairly modest amounts.

While a relatively small sum is held as cash in an interest-bearing account, the bulk of the Trust's capital continues to be held in four pooled funds. These are specifically for charities and include a property fund. Inevitably, there are quite significant changes in capital values over relatively short terms. The trustees' chief aim is to increase income over the years, taking the view that achieving such increases will result in satisfactory capital values over the longer term.

Once again, the trustees express their gratitude to Mr Ian Nelson for his professional services as Honorary Independent Examiner for the Trust.
