Structure, governance and management

The method and appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. Members of the P.C.C. when elected serve for a period of three years and may continue to serve a further term if reelected. All Church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCC.

Objectives and activities

Corringham PCC has the responsibility of co-operating with the Rector The Revd. David Rollins, in promoting the ecclesiastical parish and mission of the Church pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. It also has maintenance responsibilities for the Church Plant, St. Mary the Virgin Church, Church Road Corringham and St. John the Evangelist Church and Hall, St. John's Way Corringham.

Achievements and Performance

Church Attendance

There were 98 people on the Electoral Roll as reported at the APCM 2014, 43 of whom were non-resident within the Parish. The average weekly attendance during 2014 was 72 on Sundays and 10 on weekdays, with services held five days a week with extra services for festivals.

Review of the year

The full P.C.C. met 7 times during the year with an average level of 90% attendance. Issues relating to the fabric of both buildings were discussed. Within St Mary's these related to the installation and completion of the spiral staircase to the first floor of the tower from the vestry, the condition of the flaking paintwork from water ingression, repair of displaced tiles from the roof of the porch, and maintenance of the cremated remains area . Money within the Repair fund was used for any costs incurred. At St John's repairs were needed to the flat roof and keying together of roof covering joints.

Mission and evangelism continued to be a focus; Christmas cards were once again distributed to every household within the parish and Hot Cross Buns shared on Good Friday in the town centre linked with the Baptist Church. A Mission Weekend was planned with a Garden Party and a Teddy Bears Picnic for the community. Ways to further engage younger members was also a focus with the creation of Messy Mass and the continuation of Little Feet and our Yes (Youth encountering spirituality) group who helped to raise their own funding to attend the Walsingham Youth Pilgrimage. All our youth functions, social events and outreach to the community have worked across our United Benefice which we share with Fobbing. Both Parishes remain autonomous in their administration and funding.

Deanery issues have been shared particularly around the creation of Ministry units, discussion of which has been reported back. Health and safety, and social committee functions have been discussed at every meeting.

Financial Review

Total receipts to our accounts for 2014 were £93,053. Within this £89,467 was paid to our current account, $\pounds 2,619$ paid to our Repair Fund and $\pounds 967$ in accumulated interest. A further $\pounds 9,750$ was added to our CCLA Deposit Fund investment. Of the total income $\pounds 30,863$ was restricted funding, $\pounds 15,715$ for the new area for ashes and towards a new organ, $\pounds 1,598$ in donations for charities, and $\pounds 13,550$ in Occasional service fees for the Diocese and travel passing through our accounts. An overview of all receipts is detailed in the financial statements.

 \pounds 74,305 was spent to provide the day to day expenditure of running both churches, \pounds 62,962 of general income and \pounds 11,343 of restricted funding. This includes the contribution to the diocesan parish share, which largely provides for our clergy. For 2014 our Parish Share increased by £455. Our share was paid in full.

Other restricted funding was used to transfer £15,613 to the Diocese for occasional fees, and £1598 passed to charities with an extra £243 added from general funds. The overview of payments is detailed in our financial statements. All accounts have been independently examined.

Sunday Morning Coffee, Lunch Club, and Call in for Coffee all included in the financial review are organisations in the name of the Church who hold their own accounts. None of the money passes through the PCC accounts.

The net result for the year was an excess of receipts over payments of £327 within our general account and repair fund.

Our Financial Report was approved by the PCC on 17th March 2015 and signed on their behalf by Revd. David Rollins (PCC chairman).
